

Pony Club Queensland Scoring Handbook Revised for 2021

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General Requirements

All score sheets are contained in the appendix. Electronic copies are available on the PCQ website and from the PCQ Office.

Score sheets should be prepared with competitors'/horses' names prior to the event wherever possible.

DRESSAGE

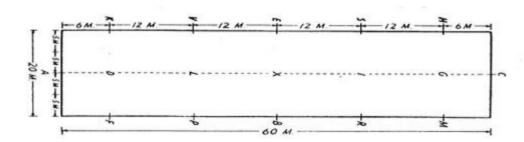
These notes to be read in conjunction with current PCQ Rule Book

Overall Placings to 10th at State Events (Aug 19) ('20)

As of 2020 EA dressage tests will be used.

A **Dressage Competition** is a test performed in an arena, generally 20m x 60m but maybe 20 x 40m. The horse's performance is judged, in most instances by two people. The judges are mainly looking at the horse's paces, freedom and regularity, impulsion and desire to move forward, submission, attention and confidence and acceptance of the bit. The rider's position, seat, and correctness and effect of aids are also marked.

The **Centre Line Judge** is always at the marked position "C" and is the Chief Judge. The other judge is positioned on an extension of either side line at M or H and/or at E or B.



PRIOR PREPARATION FOR EVENT

- Obtain services/approval of accredited Technical Delegate from PCQ list
- Obtain services/approval of accredited judges from the list issued from PCQ.
- Obtain copy of draw and prepare Master Sheets, 2 copies one for scorer, one for notice board, with names of competitors in each group and/or grade or enter into Computer.
- For ease of dealing with large numbers, colour co-ordinate test sheets use coloured dots, stars etc, and/or different coloured dashes etc. - according to group/grade where possible, i.e. Class 2 11 & u. 13yrs or CT Class 11 on initial sheet before photocopying.
- Allow two sheets per rider per test + 10% spare.
- Clipboards for Dressage Tests.
- Blue/Black biros, two per clipboard (NOT PENCILS) plus highlighter
- Copy of draw on each clipboard.
- Names of Judge, Penciller and No. of arena on Clipboard (See diagram 1)
- At the start of the day, all performance cards (if required) should be sorted into competitors' groups and given to the Scoring Supervisor.
- If the rider does not produce the performance card, no ribbons or trophies should be given to that rider until the card is presented either to the organiser or to PCQ.
- Nominations that do not have Horse Registration Number AND riders do not have performance card on the day, <u>will compete HC. (June 11).</u>
- Make sure Gear Stewards, Pencillers, Announcer, and Scorers have an up-to-date copy of the draw with all scratchings/alterations clearly marked.
- Pencillers to write Rider's Number and Name on sheet as they come up for salute or as they go past the judge's car - prevents marks being entered for wrong rider. If names are pre-entered judges and pencillers must be vigilant.
- Penciller to ensure each movement mark to one (1) decimal place eg. 6.0, 6.5

JUDGING

Each competitor is judged on a number of tests at their appropriate level. Examples of different test sheets are given (Diagram 1- Page 10)

Other Requirements

The Scoring area will be OUT OF BOUNDS, and should be as quiet an area as possible.

A person, other than the scorer, to answer inquiries.

Marked sheets, duly signed by the Judge must be treated as confidential until given to the competitor when they become his or her private property. Judges may, on the completion of their allocated competition, review these papers with a candidate or co judge but must not alter any markings on the sheets.

Scorers must be impartial.

If at all possible, it is preferable that scorers should not have children competing.

Judges to indicate on Dressage Test paper judging position eg. Centre Line (CL) or Side Line (SL)

Personnel Required.

Runners

Approximately 1 runner for every 3 rings should be provided. Runners should be provided with a bag or pocket folder to collect sheets so that none are misplaced. It is essential that RELIABLE runners collect sheets from judges ON A REGULAR BASIS. DO NOT ALLOW A BUILD UP OF SHEETS WHICH MAY HOLD UP THE END RESULTS OF THE GROUP. START AFTER 3-4 RIDERS, even after two riders if you have three or four rings.

METHOD OF SCORING

Scorer A - Collator Scorer B - Calculates Scorer C - Scribes

Scorer A (Collator)

- Obtains sheets from runner.
- Collates sheets making sure both sheets apply to the same competitor.
- Staples two sheets together with Centre Line Judge's Sheet on top.
- Check all movements have been marked, alterations initialed and sheets signed. If not return the sheet immediately to the judge concerned. If judge cannot recall the movement, or cannot be found, the mark allocated should be the average of the collective marks at the end (to the nearest whole number).
- ½ marks are allowed for straight dressage.
- Calculate co-efficient included in most tests, i.e. multiplying factor of 2, at a square beside the mark given by the judge, multiply that mark by 2, the result (to be written in pencil) becomes the mark for that movement. (See Diagram 1 - Page 10)
- Check for errors of course if only one judge has marked an error, ask Technical Delegate to check with Centre Line Judge. Errors should be indicated on sheets by pencillers as shown on Diagram 2 but a check should be made of complete sheet.
 ideally errors and penalties should be highlighted by penciller)

NB. Marks on sheets other than co-efficient must not be altered by scorers.

NB. Alterations to Judges Marks <u>MUST</u> be initialed by the Judge.

<u>Scorers B</u> - Scorers to work in pairs, one to add and one to check, even when using computer scoring. Number of pairs depends on the number of entries. As a guide, one pair per two rings.

- Adds each sheet to find total of good marks, (Points allocated by judges are good points, not penalty points).
- Deduct points from **individual** total on each sheet for any errors of course. (1st error -2 points, 2nd error -4 pts. 3rd Elimination) **or penalties**('20) before totals are added together.
- Add totals of the two judges' marks together, average them, i.e. divide by 2.
- Resulting mark should be shown as a percentage of the total possible score for that test.

Write score clearly at the top of sheet and circle. All percentages should be taken to 2 decimal places. (See Diagram 1 - Page 10)

NB. All calculations should be clearly set out at the foot of the top sheet for each test.

Scorer C - Scribe (Can be scorer A when numbers are small)

- Marks entered on Master Sheet or Computer Printout at regular intervals as per Diagram 2 - Page 11. When all marks have been entered on the Master Sheet, placings may be calculated. The higher percentage is the winner in each group/grade.
- Master Sheets/Computer Printout should be posted on the result board and scores entered at regular intervals throughout the competition.
- Test sheets must be made available to riders at the same time as final results for the group or grade are posted on the board.
- Results must be displayed for at least 30 minutes before presentation of awards, to allow time for protests to be considered. Any protests made after 30 minutes will not be considered under any circumstances. Note time of results posted on Master Sheet.

Individual and Age Group Champion

- Placement Points are awarded on a descending scale from 10 to 1, i.e. 10 points for 1st, 9 for 2nd etc. ('20)
- Placings (in blue/black) and points (in red) should be marked on Master Sheets.
- For individual classes (tests) where equal placings occur, the average of the points available for these placings are to be allotted to each horse eg = 2^{nd} : 9 + 8 = 17, 17 ÷ 2 = 8.5pts.
- Age/grade champion, add points for placings in each test to obtain total for rider.
 For example, a rider with a 1st placing in the group for one test (10 points) and a third placing for a second test (8 points) would have an overall total of 18 points.
- The Champion is the rider with the most points, regardless of the number of tests performed.

<u>In the event of a tie</u>, the actual marks or percentage for the number of tests involved will be averaged and the rider with the highest average score will be the Champion. If still equal, the rider who has obtained the highest mark in the highest test will be winner, ask TD which test this is for each group.

Combined Groups:

- Three (3) competitive riders make a group.
- Groups of less than three (3) riders may be combined with a lower group-
- However, for dressage organisers are encouraged to run the group so that
 riders have the opportunity to qualify and gain experience in their correct
 grade. ('20) If in straight dressage they are they <u>must all</u> ride the lower test.
- Competitions with less than 3 riders remain unofficial and do not count towards team placings. See exception for State events.
- If one or two riders have been nominated for a class, or if after close of nominations the number decreases, the organisers have the right to combine the group/s.
- Combined Groups are treated as ONE group for the purpose of calculating the result of the class ie 10 & u Official/11-13 yrs Official – same Dressage tests, same judges.
- If overall awards are given, the organisers are not required to give an award of the same value to the overall winner of any class with less than three (3) competitors. ('20)

Seniors:

- Seniors are a recognised Age Group at all but State Championships and therefore must be offered the opportunity to compete.
- Seniors do not form part of an official team.
- Organisers may run Seniors **under Option A or Option B** and must be stated on programme which option is being applied to the event.
- Option A: Seniors to choose from classes 3, 4, 5 (Official Preliminary/Novice/Elementary) to be eligible for overall awards, but if no class is stated will ride in Class 3 Official Preliminary (Jan.09)
 - o They compete as though they are part of the group.
 - They are placed as if they were in the group AND THEN they are recorded separately so they do not take a place from a rider under 26 (eg Jan (senior) is placed 3rd in Official Preliminary, so is awarded 8 points on the senior scoresheet; the next placed under 26 rider in the group is then placed 3rd.)
 - If there is equality for overall senior, the rider in the higher level is placed ahead of the other.
- Option B: Seniors will compete as ONE GROUP in Class 6, which will consist of one Official Preliminary test and on Official Novice Test.
 - Should Seniors wish to ride outside of the designated Seniors class they may ride HC in any official class. (Aug.12)
 - o If there is equality for overall senior, it is calculated as for other groups.

Results

Every attempt should be made to present awards for individual classes as soon as possible after this time has elapsed.

Results to be forwarded to PCAQ within 7 days of the competition.

Qualifying Criteria for State Championships

Where a rider obtains a score of 55% ('20) in a test, a **Q** must be placed by their placing on the result sheet.

As one HC performance will count as a qualifier, it is necessary to also show if HC competitor gained a Q.

Performance Card Recorder (Can be Scorer C when numbers are small)

Performance Cards must be handed to Organising Secretary at beginning of the competition (usually when collecting back nos.)

A person should be appointed to take charge of entering results on performance cards. Results should be entered on Performance Cards at regular intervals throughout the day.

Riders under 13 years at official dressage days will compete in their respective age group. They may ride any grade of horse as long as it is their normal pony club mount. No grading points are awarded.

Results at Zone Championships, run as qualifiers for State Championships, may have the results recorded on the Performance Card,

Please note that placement ('20) points awarded for placings in each class (10th down to 1st) are NOT grading ('20) points.

AS FROM 2020:

- %'s to 55% for dressage. ('20)
- There will be no points allocated for placings, just %'s which will be used for state qualifications. ('20)
- Rider 13 & U26 years may choose their grading for each competition ie novice one competition / elementary the next. ('20)
- For State competitions, a horse/rider combination must compete at the highest qualified grade as recorded on their grading card. ('20)

TEAM COMPETITION- Scoring as per Zone and State Teams

Scoring of Zone and State teams where groups are combined according to PCQ combined Groups please refer to pg 62 in this document.

A separate score sheet should be used with riders listed in clubs/zones (See Diagram 5 - Page 10).

- A Team is selected from the four best scorers all belonging to one club or zone with
 the three best scores to count. A team of three is acceptable and may beat a team of
 4. Where a club has more than 4 riders, the first team will be the four highest scorers
 and the second team will commence with the fifth highest scorer. Scores are taken
 from points awarded for overall placings in Groups/Grades.
- At State Level riders stay in their age groups and within their zone, no composite teams, exception mounted games. ('20)
- 12 & Under Riders (this includes 10 & under) are included in all teams.
- A team with less than 3 riders remaining in competition cannot be placed at all.
- Seniors or riders in unofficial classes are not allowed in teams unless an unofficial competition is held.
- Where there are less than three (3) ('20) riders in a competition only first overall place getter is eligible for Team.
- Club/Zone may choose to run Teams Competition where the actual riders must be named before the start of competitions and results are taken from points awarded for overall placings in Groups/Grades in the Official Section.

<u>Percy Bishop Trophy</u>: Awarded to best performed horse and rider combination over the 3 disciplines – Dressage, Combined Training & Horse Trials.

COMBINED TRAINING

These notes to be read in conjunction with current PCQ Rule Book

Overall Placings to 10th at State Events (Aug 19) ('20)

Combined Training is a two-phase competition.

Dressage and Showjumping.

The Rules for this competition will be found in the Dressage Rule Book.

The Dressage and Showjumping Tests which make up a Combined Training Competition must be taken in that order but organisers do not have to wait until all Dressage is completed before starting showjumping.

Showjumping is judged under Table A over one round on Time Allowed with no jump off. Time taken by rider must be recorded on showjumping score sheet. (2nd Step in separating a tie)

The same horse and rider must complete both tests and elimination from one test involves elimination from the whole competition.

<u>Grading</u>

As Combined Training is a two-phase competition, it is necessary to consider both phases. ('20)

Riders Choose their own dressage level and their own height for showjumping. Individual Showjumping/eventing levels have no bearing on Combined Training. 12 years & under, and 10 years & under may compete on any grade horse, provided it is their normal Pony Club mount.

There are no grading points in Combined Training. ('20)

PRIOR PREPARATION FOR ORGANISERS

Obtain the services of Technical Delegate and accredited judges from list issued from PCQ.

As per Dressage Section, plus adequate supply of showjumping score sheets. (See Diagram 5 - Page 18)

Combined Training Master Score Sheets - (See Diagram 6 - Page 19)

READ 'PRIOR PREPARATION FOR DRESSAGE EVENT'

JUDGING

Each competitor is judged on a dressage test and a showjumping round at their appropriate level and a final result arrived at by adding showjumping penalties to the dressage aggregate score. The competitor with the <u>lowest final score</u> is the winner.

SCORING

Refer to Dressage Section of Handbook.

Dressage Phase:

Half marks are used for Combined Training and ODE.

Otherwise as per Dressage up to point of obtaining average mark, i.e. on each judge's sheet the marks allotted for each movement are added and any penalties or errors of course deducted. (Errors of course: 1^{st-}2pts; 2nd - 4pts; 3rd – Elimination). Penalties as notated

The athletes" percentage is calculated on the average of good marks obtained by adding the total good marks for each judge and dividing by the number of judges. The percentage will always be rounded to two decimal places. This percentage is then converted to penalty point. This is subtracted from 100 with the resulting figure being rounded to ONE decimal digit. The result is the score, in penalty points, for the dressage test. The percentage is required to be shown on Master Sheet as it is part of Qualifying Criteria for State Events.

<u>Jumping Phase</u>: check that faults are added correctly across the page and that jumping and time faults (0.4 penalty for every commenced second)

Total Penalties incurred in showjumping phase (both time and jumping penalties) are entered on the Master Score Sheet and then <u>added</u> to the dressage penalty points to obtain competitor's final score.

Equality: If there is an equality of points between two or more competitors, the highest marks for the Dressage test will decide. If there is still equality, the closest to the optimum time (under the time set) in the jumping test determines the result. All competitors' times for jumping round must be entered on judging sheets.

<u>Master Sheets</u> should be posted on the results board and scores entered at regular intervals throughout the competition.

Dressage Test Sheets must be made available to riders on completion of the Dressage phase for their group, and an announcement made that results are posted.

<u>Combined Groups</u> are treated as ONE group for the purpose of calculating the result of the class.

Results must be displayed for at least 30 Minutes before presentation of awards to allow time for protests to be considered. Time of posting should be noted on the Master Score Sheet. After 30 minutes, no further protests will be considered.

Results must be forwarded to PCQ within 7 days of the event.

Qualifying Criteria for State Events:

A result of 50%('20) in Dressage phase and not more than 4 penalties in Showjumping phase gives a qualifying result and a $\bf Q$ is recorded next to their name on Result sheet. It is recommended that a $\bf Q$ be shown on all riders' performance cards who have achieved a qualifying result.

As one HC performance will count as a qualifier, it is necessary to also show if HC competitor gained a Q.

<u>Results at Zone Championships</u>, run as qualifiers for State Championships, may have the results recorded on the Performance Card.

Combined Groups:

- Three (3) competitive riders make a group.
- Groups of less than three (3) riders may be combined with a lower group-
- However, for dressage organisers are encouraged to run the group so that riders have the
 opportunity to qualify and gain experience in their correct grade. ('20) If in straight
 dressage they are they <u>must</u> all ride the lower test.
- Competitions with less than 3 riders remain unofficial and do not count towards team placings. See exception for State events.
- If one or two riders have been nominated for a class, or if after close of nominations the number decreases, the organisers have the right to combine the group/s. Combine according to their **Dressage Level** but jump their own heights, e.g. say B1(2 riders), B2(2 riders) and B3(1 rider). All compete together for dressage test.
- Combined Groups are treated as ONE group for the purpose of calculating the result of the class ie 10 & u Official/12 & u Official – same Dressage test, just jump different heights.
- If overall awards are given, the organisers are not required to give an award of the same value to the overall winner of any class with less than three (3) competitors. ('20)

Seniors:

- Seniors are a recognised Age Group at all but State Championships and therefore must be offered the opportunity to compete.
- Seniors all do the same dressage test but choose their jumping height/grade for Showjumping phase. To be eligible for overall Senior award choice must compete in Showjumping phase with heights of 80cm, 95cm or 1.10.
- If Seniors do not state height on nomination form will jump 80cm (Jan09).
- If there is equality for overall senior, the rider in the higher level Showjumping is placed ahead of the other, if in the same level where there is more than one group, e.g. A1 Group 1 and A1 Group 2, then calculated as for other groups as per rule book.

PERFORMANCE CARDS

Performance Cards must be handed to Organising Secretary at beginning of the competition (usually when collecting back numbers.

A person should be appointed to take charge of entering results ('20) on performance cards.

Three (3) competitive riders make a group and therefore are not combined. If one or two riders have been nominated for a class, or if after close of nominations the number decreases, the organisers have the right to combine the group/s. Competitions with less than three (3) riders remain unofficial and do not count towards team placings. This should not arise and should be combined as follows:

The competition will be combined according to their Dressage level but jump their own height and same course.

Placings: Combined Groups are treated as ONE group for the purpose of calculating the result of the class, ignoring the different heights jumped. ('20)

TEAM COMPETITION- Scoring as per Zone and State Teams

Scoring of Zone and State teams where groups are combined according to PCQ combined Groups please refer to pg 62 in this document.

A separate score sheet should be used with riders listed in clubs/zones (See Diagram 5 - Page 10).

• A Team is selected from the four best scorers all belonging to one club or zone with the three best scores to count. A team of three is acceptable and may beat a team of 4. Where a club has more than 4 riders, the first team will be the four highest scorers and the second

team will commence with the fifth highest scorer. Scores are taken from points awarded for overall placings in Groups/Grades.

- At State Level riders stay in their age groups and within their zone, no composite teams, exception mounted games. ('20)
- 12 & Under Riders (this includes 10 & under) are included in all teams.
- A team with less than 3 riders remaining in competition cannot be placed at all.
- Seniors or riders in unofficial classes are not allowed in teams unless an unofficial competition is held.
- Where there are less than three (3) ('20) riders in a competition only first overall place getter is eligible for Team.
- Club/Zone may choose to run Teams Competition where the actual riders must be named before the start of competitions and results are taken from points awarded for overall placings in Groups/Grades in the Official Section.

HORSE TRIALS and SHORT COURSE EVENTING

Overall Placings to 10th at State Events (Aug 19) ('20)

All Horse Trials Competition (or ODE) consist of three separate Tests: Dressage; Cross Country; Showjumping. The marks, shown as penalties, are cumulative.

The competitor with the lowest penalty score will be the winner.

The Dressage test is always held first. The order of cross country and jumping phases is optional, but must be clearly stated in the programme or on the draw. Showjumping may be held prior to the cross country, depending on numbers.

PRIOR PREPARATION FOR ORGANISERS

- Obtain the services of Technical Delegate
- Obtain services of accredited judges from list issued from PCQ.
- Obtain services of other personnel required

A Pony Club competition can be held in conjunction with an EA competition.

<u>Score sheets</u> can be obtained from PCQ website - Dressage test sheet, cross-country obstacle sheet, time sheet, and tally sheet, Master sheet OR photocopied from samples in this book.

Dressage & Cross Country - Colour co-ordinate all score sheets with age/grade group, using the same colours as the discs marking the cross country jumps, i.e. Yellow for One Star, Pink for Pre-Novice, Buff or another pastel colour or white with a red sticker for Preliminary (red is hard to read), White for Introductory, Orange for 12 Years and Under Introductory. (Introductory course should present a greater degree of difficulty than that for 12 & under although heights and widths remain the same) and Green for Pre-Introductory. Any other colour for unofficial classes can be used.

Combined Groups:

- Three (3) competitive riders make a group.
- Groups of less than three (3) riders may be combined with a lower group-
- However, for dressage organisers are encouraged to run the group so that riders have the opportunity to qualify and gain experience in their correct grade. ('20) If in straight dressage they are they must all ride the lower test.
- Competitions with less than 3 riders remain unofficial and do not count towards team placings. See exception for State events.
- However, If one or two riders have been nominated for a class, or if after close of nominations the number decreases, the organisers have the right to combine the group/s. Competitors will do the same dressage test (riders to be informed of which test) but jump their own height/s for cross country and showjumping and ride at their respective speeds.
- If overall awards are given, the organisers are not required to give an award of the same value to the overall winner of any class with less than three (3) competitors. (20)

Placings: Combined Groups are treated as ONE (1) group for the purpose of calculating the result of the class. The Organising Committee are not required to give an award of the same value to the winner of any class with less than three (3) competitors. ('20)

Seniors:

Seniors are a recognised Age Group at all but State Championships and

- therefore must be offered the opportunity to compete.
- Seniors ALL do the same Dressage Test, penalty points for Cross Country & Showjumping are added to Dressage penalty points, ignoring different heights.
- Seniors choose the height level they wish to compete in: Pre-Intro, Intro, Prelim, One Star and Two Star. If not stated will be placed in Intro.
- Seniors to be eligible for overall award must participate in Official Classes, 13 & Over
- If there is equality for overall Senior, the rider in the higher level is placed ahead
 of the other. If in the same level, then calculated as for other groups as per rule
 book.
- Seniors do not form part of an official team.

<u>Cross Country Timing Equipment</u> - will need a Timekeeper, a Penciller and a person (who may be either out on course or in the scoring room) to calculate the time penalties OR the computer programme; and a copy of the draw.

<u>The Master Score Sheet</u> should be placed on the result board at the end of each phase and remain on the board at all times. Scorers retain a smaller version of the master sheet in the scoring room. This must be kept up to date at regular intervals.

MEDICAL/FIRST AID REQUIREMENTS

- There should be present an ambulance, doctor, St. John Ambulance personnel or, as a minimum requirement, a person holding a current senior first aid certificate or a registered nurse.
- It is highly recommended that an Ambulance and/or paramedic be in attendance for the cross country phase. ('20)
- The First Aid person must have no other duties and should wear a clearly visible bib or armband designating this duty.
- A First Aid station must be provided
- In the case of horse trials, both the showjumping and cross country to have separate first aid personnel if they are running at the same time.
- Emergency vehicles must be able to access all parts of the ground
- Local ambulance and hospital must be advised of the location of the event
- Riders who have fallen to be assessed by First Aid Personnel before continuing the event if they have a second ride.

Veterinary: If possible, a Veterinary Surgeon should be present during the jumping and cross country tests and must be available on call for the duration of the event. A horse float and hessian for emergencies should also be available.

Communication: The Organising Committee must arrange adequate communication involving all emergency services and key officials.

HANDY HINTS

- Jump Stewards on the Cross Country Jumps **MUST** put their name and mobile phone no. on each sheet together with the jump number and jump name.
- Timekeeper must be familiar with operation of the stopwatch &/or timing equipment.
- Each rider should be sent out exactly on the minute or half minute.
- Runners reliable persons for collecting dressage sheets from the judges on a regular basis are essential, as this could hold up the whole day. A suitable bag or folder should be provided for collection of sheets so none are misplaced.
- Mounted Stewards collecting cross country sheets must also be very reliable and must bring in sheets on a very regular basis, certainly after each group has gone through.
- It is helpful to have someone in charge of each phase, i.e. Dressage Co-ordinator/Steward, Cross Country Co-ordinator/Steward and Showjumping Co-ordinator/Steward.

SCORING

Dressage Phase - Also read information under Dressage on page 4

Judges marking sheets, with remarks duly signed by the judge, must be treated as confidential until given to the competitor when they become his or her private property. Sheets should be made available to competitors when all Dressage marks for the group have been posted. Note time on master sheet.

Scorer A

Collate dressage sheets, staple them together with centre line judge's sheet on the top.

Check all movements are marked

Check for errors of course and that they are on both sheets.

Errors (Cumulative) 1st 2; 2nd 4; 3rd Elimination

Make sure judge has signed sheet

(If any of the above have not been completed, ask Technical Delegate to refer to Centre Line Judge on arena concerned.)

Calculate any co-efficients.

<u>Scorers B & C</u> (work in pairs - one to calculate and one to check all calculations, this second person may be the Official Scorer who enters the results, either manually or by computer)

Add up dressage marks on each sheet and check for errors of course.

The good marks from 0-10 awarded by <u>each judge</u> to a competitor for each numbered movement of the Dressage Test together with the collective marks are added together deducting any error of course or test.

<u>For each judge</u>, the mark as a PERCENTAGE of maximum possible good marks obtainable is then calculated. This percentage is obtained by dividing total good marks of the judge (minus any error of course) by maximum possible good marks obtainable and then multiplying by 100 and rounding the result to two decimal digits. This value is then shown as the individual mark (percentage) for this judge.

Average percentage for the competitor is obtained by adding together the percentage for each judge and dividing by the number of judges, always rounding the result to two decimal digits.

In order to convert average percentage into penalty points, this must be subtracted from 100. ('20) The result, always rounded to one (1) decimal digit, is the score in penalty points for the test. Write the total of penalties clearly at the top of the sheet and circle.

When checked, sheets should be handed to Scorer C (or Scorer D if numbers necessitate having a fourth scorer. Scorer C or D is the Official Scorer who enters the results, either done manually or by computer).

Scorer C (or D)

Enters the dressage penalties on the Master Sheets and puts the results on the result board at regular intervals, either manually or by computer. (See Diagram 12 - Page 31) If there is a Team Competition, this Scorer transposes scores to a Team Score Sheet (See Diagram 13 - Page 32).

Dressage test sheets MUST be made available to riders at the completion of the dressage phase for that group when marks are posted.

Cross Country Phase:

Scorer A

Collates jump sheets (See Diagram 10 - Page 29) in chronological order of jumps, refer Chief Steward or Technical Delegate if any sheets appear to be missing as early as possible.

Check Jump No. and Stewards Name is on each sheet.

Check that no sheet contains more than one group. If it does, sheet should be clearly marked where new grade/group starts.

Check Stewards remarks - if any need clarification refer Chief Steward or Technical Delegate.

Scorers B & C (working in pairs)

Scorer B reads to Scorer C from cross country jump sheet for each jump in turn, calling rider's number and penalties incurred, if any.

Scorer C marks the cross country tally sheet accordingly (See Diagram 11 - Page 30). If any result should be in question, the result square for that rider should be left blank until query is answered.

Do not assume that riders will continue to be recorded at each jump in chronological order - riders regularly overtake each other on course, or may be eliminated.

Eliminations: First fall of rider and first fall of horse anywhere on the cross country course results in elimination, or fourth refusal (cumulative) on course or third refusal at the same jump.

After entering all results for the group, penalties for each rider should be added across the sheet and total cross country jumping penalties entered.

Scorer C will then enter these penalties on the Master Score Sheet (Diagram 12, page 31)

Time Sheets

Make sure time penalties are calculated from time sheets as soon as possible after the group finishes.

NB All times should be converted to seconds to enable time faults to be more easily calculated - at .4 faults per second or commenced second over optimum time and .4 faults per second or commenced second for over 20 seconds under optimum time. (See Diagram 9, page 28) Exceeding Time Limit (twice the optimum time) is elimination.

If the timekeeper has calculated penalties, these **must** be checked.

Time penalties should then be entered on the Master Score Sheet which is posted on the Result Board.

<u>Riding Down</u> is the act of competing at a lower level than that for which a horse is established.

Riding Down one level from a higher level for which a horse is established, carries no penalty.

<u>Riding Down two or more levels will incur ten penalties</u>, to be added to the total of faults for the three phases.

Transcribe to Master Sheet and bring up total penalties for all three phases.

Qualifying Criteria for State Championships: Record **Q** next to result if rider has met the Qualifying Criteria for State Championships i.e. To gain a Q at any competition, horse & rider must have a dressage score of 50% or more, with 20 <u>jumping</u> penalties or less in the cross country phase, and no restriction on time in cross country, and no restriction on time or penalties in Showjumping phase provided the combination completes the competition.

Qualifying Result: Ensure that a Q is shown on all riders' performance cards who have achieved a qualifying result. Please note that grading points no longer apply. ('20) As one HC performance will count as a qualifier, it is necessary to also show if HC competitor gained a Q.

Classification

The winner of the group/grade is the rider with the **lowest** penalty marks. The Organising Committee are not required to give an award of the same value to the winner of any class with less than three competitors.

In the case of a tie:

- The winner will be the rider with the best cross country score (total of jumping and time penalties).
- If there is still a tie, the winner will be the one whose cross country time was the closest to the optimum time.
- If still equal, the dressage mark will decide who is placed higher.
- If there is still equality, the tie will remain in the Final Classification.
- This principle applies to all tied placegetters and to teams, see Team Competition Paragraph 40.

Put Master Sheet on Result Board and note time results posted.

Results must be displayed for at least 30 minutes before presentation of awards to allow time for protests to be considered. After 30 minutes, no further protests will be considered.

Performance Cards

A person should be appointed to take charge of entering results on performance cards. Riders 12 Years and Under, at official ODE days, will compete in their respective age group. They may ride any grade of horse as long as it is their normal pony club mount. If rider does not have performance card on the day of competition, ribbons and trophies are withheld until it is produced. ('20) All nominations that do not have Horse Registration Number AND riders who do not have performance card on the day, riders will ride HC. (June 2011)

Have competitors enter the details of the event before handing in Performance cards.

E.g. Date Venue Rider's name Event e.g. Intro

All groups, competing in Official classes, including 12 & U, require a Performance cards.

Seniors do not have performance cards.

The person appointed to enter Q on performance cards only has to write Q or insert a dash and sign card, rider's placing has no bearing on whether they gain a Q. When completing overall placings in grades (10 down to 1), DO NOT complete the grading points in cards (new cards will be amended to not have this column).

Riders 13 years and under 26 years can ride in the grade appearing on their horse's performance card. They may also ride down a level from that on their card, with no penalty. Riding down two or more levels will incur 10 penalties. They are not permitted to ride up a grade at will.

Grading points no longer apply. To upgrade, riders have to achieve 3 Minimum Eligibility Requirements (MERS) – or 5 MERS to upgrade to 2* – refer to Rule Book (Application for Horse Trials' Upgrade form and performance card to be sent to PCQ with copies MERS for upgrading) ('20)

SHORT COURSE EVENTING

Short Course Eventing has been introduced.

It is designed to assist clubs to introduce their members to the Sport of Horse Trials when they may not have access to a full course of obstacles and distance required. Short Course Eventing is run under the same rules and regulations as Horse Trials with a few amendments, which are as follows.

Dressage Phase: No changes. Showjumping Phase: No changes.

Cross Country Phase:

DISTANCE: Minimum 1,000 m

NO. of OBSTACLES: 12 – 20 for all groups.

40% MAXIMUM number of Showjumps to 60% MINIMUM

number of Non-Showjumps (Fixed or Portable).

HEIGHTS: Beginners: 60cm

Introductory/12 & u. 80cm Preliminary 95cm

TIME: Due to the restricted space Speeds as follows:

SHOWJUMPING

These notes to be read in conjunction with current PCAQ Rule Book

Overall Placings to 10th at State Events (Aug 19) ('20)

PRIOR PREPARATION FOR ORGANISERS & COURSEBUILDERS

- Obtain the services of accredited Technical Delegate from PCQ list
- Obtain services of accredited judges and Course builders from list issued from PCQ.
- Ensure there is an adequate supply of showjumping score sheets for each ring allow 3 sheets per group per event. Use appropriate sheet for specific event e.g. if running Power & Speed use Showjumping sheet designed for that event.
- Name of Judge, Penciller and Ring No. on Clipboard (can include Course Builder).
- Sheets should be placed on a clipboard, together with the Draw, and sent out to the ring with the penciller. If names & numbers already entered on sheets, Judge & Penciller MUST be vigilant that correct line is used.
- Provide Pencillers with highlighters, coloured pens & ruler to help with identifying clear rounds/place getters.
- Ask person doing the Draw to clearly mark (highlight) when Seniors are in a group, and to show when groups are combined on <u>draw and result sheet</u> which height level the riders nominated for.
- For Penciller- A lined paper to keep running sheet of clear rounds & to give Announcer & Gate Steward names for jump-offs and placegetters.
- Stop watches 2 per ring.
- Bell/Whistle/Buzzer for each ring. Care should be taken that the bells etc. used in adjoining rings should not sound at all similar.
- Master Sheets for each Height or Age Group. (Diagram 18)
- Make sure gear stewards, gate stewards, pencillers, announcer and scorers have an up-to-date copy of the draw with all scratchings/alterations clearly marked.
- At start of day, collect Performance cards and hand to Scoring Supervisor.
- If the rider does not produce the performance card, no ribbons or trophies should be given to that rider until the card is presented either to the organiser or to PCQ.
- Nominations that do not have Horse Registration Number AND riders do not have performance card on the day, <u>riders will compete HC. (June11).</u>
- There is no division of groups no matter what the size. ('20)

Combined Groups:- As per relevant rulebook

Some examples include:

- a) 12 & u. 70cm (4) with 12 & u. 80cm (2);
- b) 10 & u (2) with 12 & u. 70cm (4);
- c) 10 & u. (2) with 12 & u. 70cm (4) and 12 & u. 80cm (2);
- d) 10 & u. (2) with 12 & u. 80cm (2), no 12 & u. 70cm.
- e) Only as a last resort with the Height classes for 13 years and over.

Combined Groups:

- Three (3) competitive riders make a group.
- Groups of less than three (3) riders may be combined with a lower group-
- However, for dressage organisers are encouraged to run the group so that
 riders have the opportunity to qualify and gain experience in their correct
 grade. ('20) If in straight dressage they are they must all ride the lower test.
- Competitions with less than 3 riders remain unofficial and do not count towards team placings. See exception for State events.
- However, If one or two riders have been nominated for a class, or if after close of nominations the number decreases, the organisers have the right to combine the group/s. Competitors will do jump the same course at their respective heights.
- If overall awards are given, the organisers are not required to give an award of the same value to the overall winner of any class with less than three (3) competitors. ('20)

Placings: Combined Groups are treated as ONE (1) group for the purpose of calculating the result of the class. The Organising Committee are not required to give an award of the same value to the winner of any class with less than three (3) competitors. (20)

Seniors: As per relevant rulebook

- Seniors are a recognised Age Group except at State Championships and therefore must be offered the opportunity to compete.
- Seniors to choose from classes for 13 years & over 70cm and above to be eligible for overall awards, but if no class stated on nominations will ride in 80cm (13 years & over).
- They compete as though they are part of the group.
- They are placed as if they were in the group AND THEN they are recorded separately so they do not take a place from a rider under 26.(eg Jan (senior) is placed 3rd in the 100cm, so is awarded 8 points on the senior scoresheet; the next placed U26 rider in the group is then placed 3rd)
- Seniors are placed in relation to the whole group.
- If there is equality for overall senior, the rider in the higher level is placed ahead of the other, if in the same level then calculated as for other groups as per rule book.
- Seniors do not form part of an official team.

SCORING

- Ensure that there are sufficient reliable runners to keep results coming in from each ring regularly.
- Ensure that result sheets contain the names as well as the back numbers of placegetters. Check Judge's Name and Signature are on sheets.
- Check that faults are correctly added across the page, however, this is the Judge's responsibility.
- Judges should place competitors down to 10th place.
- Check Time Penalties have been calculated correctly (1 penalty for each commenced four seconds in the first round and 1 penalty for each commenced second in the jump off round. This is also the judge's responsibility. The second round is not always the jump off round.
- Check addition on Top Score is correct. If two or more riders have achieved equal
 points, then the rider with the fastest time has the higher placing. Riders who are
 eliminated in Top Score retain the points they had gained up to elimination. Those
 competitors with the same score and a recorded time place ahead of those
 competitors on the same score without a time. These competitors without a recorded
 time will be placed equality.

- Article 273- Competition over 2 rounds (Grand Prix)
 When choosing which way to run your Grand Prix select options from each section.
 Eg Art 273.2.2.2(ii) who goes into the second round Art 273.3.3.4.2 judging Art 273.4.4.4(how to place), your program would show Grand Prix 273.2.2.2Art(ii(3.3.4.2.4.4.4- Refer to SJ rule book pg 81 for further explanation
- Other competitions check relevant rule in Showjumping Rule Book.
- If an error is found, return sheet to the Judge to make correction/s & place getters recalled if results affected.
 - See Example Score Sheet Diagram 14, page 39

Scoring for Individual classes

- Points for each class in groups are awarded 10 to 1 descending, i.e. 10 points for 1st, 9 points for 2nd, etc.
- Depending on the type of competition there may be equality of placings, e.g. in AM3 say 2 riders are on 4 penalties which puts them =3rd, average the points for 3rd & 4th, i.e. 8 + 7 = 15, divided by 2 = 7.5, each rider has 7.5 recorded for that class.

Age/Group Champion

- Winner is the rider with the highest points, add points for placings in each competition to obtain total for each rider.
- Equality of points for Individual Champion:
 - The winner is the rider with the most wins, if still equal, the most second placings, and if still equal, the most third placings.
 - If a result is still not obtained the rider who places highest in the Grand Prix will be the winner. If there is no Grand Prix event on the day then the AM6, then AM4, then AM5, then AM3.
 - If a result is still not obtained, it is the decision of the Committee to divide the Championship or run a jump-off against the clock. If a jump-off is organised, a one- round Table A should be conducted.

However, If one or two riders have been nominated for a class, or if after close of nominations the number decreases, the organisers have the right to combine the group/s. Competitors will do the same dressage test (riders to be informed of which test) but jump their own height/s for cross country and showjumping and ride at their respective speeds.

Combined Groups

• Combined Groups are treated as ONE group for the purpose of calculating the result for each class and overall awards, i.e. Penalties and time judged equally, ignoring the different heights. Example:

Peter (120cm)	4 pen. 31.6 secs 2 nd Paul
(110cm)	0 pen. 35.0 secs 1st Mary
(110cm)	4 pen. 33.4 secs 3 rd

RESULTS

<u>Results of each competition</u> are awarded by the Judge. If an error is found, placegetters are recalled and awards re-distributed.

<u>Overall Awards:</u> Results must be displayed for at least 30 minutes before presentation of overall awards to allow time for protests to be considered. After 30 minutes, no further protests will be considered.

QUALIFYING FOR STATE EVENTS:

Riders need to obtain a CLEAR FIRST ROUND in a <u>Table A Competition</u> to obtain a qualifying performance. This includes Power section of Power & Speed, and second round of a Grand Prix if it is not the jump-off round and the rider has not already gone clear in the first round.

A **Q** is entered next to their name on the result sheet for each qualifying performance.

A Q is to be shown on all riders' performance cards who have achieved a qualifying result.

As one HC performance will count as a qualifier, it is necessary to also show if HC competitor gained a Q. This would rarely occur in Showjumping as riders can have two competitive horses.

Results must be forwarded to PCAQ within 7 days of the competition.

Performance Cards

FOR STATE EVENTS, HORSES WILL COMPETE IN THE HIGHEST HEIGHT THEY QUALIFIED IN.

THERE ARE NO GRADING POINTS FOR HEIGHT CLASSES OR ANY AGE GROUPS.

Performance Cards must be handed to Organising Secretary at beginning of the competition (usually when collecting back numbers.)

Have competitors enter the details of the event before handing in Performance cards.

E.g. Date Venue Rider's name Event e.g. A1

The person appointed to enter Q on performance cards only has to write Q or insert a dash and sign card, rider's placing has no bearing on whether they gain a Q.

All groups including 12 & u AND 10 & u. require a Performance cards. Seniors do not have performance cards.

Results at Zone Championships, run as qualifiers for State Championships, MUST have the results recorded on the Performance Card.

A person should be appointed to take charge of entering results on performance cards after each class is finalised.

Riders under 13 years compete in their respective age group, although 10 & u have the option to rider in 12 & u. They may ride any grade of horse as long as it is their normal pony club mount

Riders 13 years and under 26 years may nominate in ANY height ranging from 70cm to 120cm. This height may change from one competition day to another, i.e. riders can choose their height for the day.

The horse may have a different rider from one competition day to another.

A rider may have two competitive horses in the same or different heights.

Nominations that do not have the Horse Registration No. AND riders do not have Performance Card on the day, will compete HC (June 2011).

TEAM COMPETITION- Scoring as per Zone and State Teams

Scoring of Zone and State teams where groups are combined according to PCQ combined Groups please refer to pg 62 in this document. (20)

A separate score sheet should be used with riders listed in clubs/zones (See Diagram 5 - Page 10).

- A Team is selected from the four best scorers all belonging to one club or zone with the three best scores to count. A team of three is acceptable and may beat a team of 4. Where a club has more than 4 riders, the first team will be the four highest scorers and the second team will commence with the fifth highest scorer. Scores are taken from points awarded for overall placings in Groups/Grades.
- At State Level riders stay in their age groups and within their zone, no composite teams, exception mounted games. ('20)
- 12 & Under Riders (this includes 10 & under) are included in all teams.
- A team with less than 3 riders remaining in competition cannot be placed at all.
- Seniors or riders in unofficial classes are not allowed in teams unless an unofficial competition is held.
- Where there are less than three (3) riders in a competition only first overall place getter is eligible for Team.
- Club/Zone may choose to run Teams Competition where the actual riders must be named before the start of competitions and results are taken from points awarded for overall placings in Groups/Grades in the Official Section.
- 10 and u. and 12 & under riders and riders 13 years & over are NOT allowed in teams where an actual jumping event is held as a Teams Event at a height above what they have

nominated on the day. E.g. Teams event commencing at 90cm would not have 12 & u or 13 & o. at 70 or 80cm. Club/Zone may choose to run Teams Competition where the actual riders compete as a team over the same course. A Team to consist of 4 riders all belonging to one club, best 3 scores to count. A team of 3 is acceptable and may beat a team of 4. Composite teams may be allowed only where riders have insufficient numbers to form a team from their own club. At State Level riders stay in their age groups and within their zone, no composite teams, exception mounted games. i.e. if there are 5 riders from one club, the 5th rider is free to join a team from another club. Equality of Penalties: If two or more teams are equal for first place after Round 1, the teams jump off. Scores are arrived at by adding together the penalties, both jumping and time, of the three best members of each team for that round. If still equal, the combined times of the three best members of each team will decide the winners. (Diagram 16 - Page 41)

JUMPING EQUITATION

These notes to be read in conjunction with current PCQ Rule Book

Overall Placings to 10th at State Events (Aug 19) ('20)

PRIOR PREPARATION FOR ORGANISERS & COURSEBUILDERS

- Obtain services of Technical Delegate from list issued from PCAQ
- Obtain services of accredited judges & course builder from list issued from PCAQ
- Obtain score sheets or score books from PCAQ (2 sheets per rider, per round + 10%)
- Obtain services of pencillers who are familiar with symbols used on score sheets, Clubs are required to provide helpers at 1 helper per every 3 riders, these people can be used for pencillers or rail stewards. If they are to be pencillers, let them know so they can learn symbols.
- Two pencillers will be required for each ring one for each judge
- Clipboards (& biros) with name of judge, penciller and Arena on each.
- Score Sheets (Diagram 17 Page 45) and Draw go out with penciller for each judge.
- Suggest 4 judges for the day (and 4 pencillers) to alternate judges and keep ring running.
- Draw for each clipboard, Gear Steward, Announcer, Scorer.
- Penciller to write Rider's No. on sheet as they enter arena, if sheets are prenumbered Judge and Penciller must be vigilant correct sheet is used.

Scorer A

- Collates sheets with Judge 1 on top, this may change between classes.
- Make sure judges have signed and initialled all sheets and marked No. 1 Judge.
- Judge to initial any alterations to awarded marks
- · Checks for disobediences or rails
- Checks that all sections have been filled out
- Calculates total points on both sheets
- Adds Judges 1 and 2 and average, and % for qualifying for State Event. If using computer programme these calculations are done automatically.
- Fills out box

Scorer B

- Checks all additions either manually or enters into computer (2ndcheck) etc.
- Transfers to Master Scoresheet (See Diagram 18 Page 46)
- Assemble sheets for distribution to riders, sheets maybe required again if there equality for overall placings.

OR

A third person (scorer) may be seated with the Judge & Penciller to add up the sheets and put sheets in order while the event is in progress to facilitate efficiency.

Individual Rounds

The winner is the rider with the highest mark.

Half Marks can be used in Jumping Equitation. (January 2019)

The judges marks are added together and averaged to find the final mark which will be out of 110 if there is no task and 120 if there is one and 130 if there are two tasks. The final mark is converted to a percentage. In the event of equality of percentage in:

A. Individual rounds the riders are placed equal.

- B. Overall age champion: Equality of overall awards are decided by average over the number of rounds. If still equal then go back to the highest percentage in the round with the task. In a State event where two rounds have a task the average of the two rounds is used.
- C. Teams: The same procedure applies for teams as the overall age champion.

Seniors:

- Seniors are a recognised Age Group at all but State Championships and therefore must be offered the opportunity to compete.
- Seniors to choose from classes Official classes, except 10 & u. (50cm) to be eligible for overall awards, but if no class is stated will ride in 15 & u. 17 (80cm).
- They compete as though they are part of the group.
- They are placed as if they were in the group AND THEN they are recorded separately so they do not take a place from a rider under 26.(eg Jan (senior) is placed 3rd in the 13 & u.15, so is awarded 8 points on the senior scoresheet; the next placed U26 rider in the group is then placed 3rd.
- If there is equality for overall senior, the rider in the higher level is placed ahead of the other, if in the same level then calculated as for other groups as per guidelines mentioned above and in rule book.
- Seniors do not form part of an official team.

Combined Groups:

- Three (3) competitive riders make a group.
- Groups of less than three (3) riders may be combined with a lower group-
- However, for dressage organisers are encouraged to run the group so that riders have the opportunity to qualify and gain experience in their correct grade. ('20) If in straight dressage they are they <u>must_all</u> ride the lower test.
- Competitions with less than 3 riders remain unofficial and do not count towards team placings. See exception for State events.
- However, each age group jumps its own height, e.g. one rider in 13 & u. 15 jumps 70cm and three riders in 15 & u. 17 jump 80cm. Combined groups must jump the same course and have the same judge/s
- Combined Groups are treated as ONE group for the purpose of calculating the result of the class and overall awards, i.e. ignore the different heights.

Eg: Becky (13-15)	59%
Harry (15-17)	57%
Joe (17-21)	51%
Mary (15-17)	52%

• If overall awards are given, the organisers are not required to give an award of the same value to the overall winner of any class with less than three (3) competitors. ('20)

Placings: Combined Groups are treated as ONE (1) group for the purpose of calculating the result of the class. The Organising Committee are not required to give an award of the same value to the winner of any class with less than three (3) competitors. ('20)

To calculate %:

- Add each judge's sheet to find total good marks.
- Deduct points from each judge's sheet for any jumping penalties (e.g. 4 penalties for rail knocked down; 4 penalties for 1st disobedience, 8 penalties for 2nd disobedience).
- Add totals together and average them.
- Show final mark as a %.

Example: Judge 1 65 Judge 2 71

Total possible marks: 110 (if there is a task increase by 10) 65 + 71 = 136 $136 \div 2 = 68$ $68 \times 100 = 61.81\%$ OR 68 = 61.81% 1.1

Results

Of each round should be displayed for 30 Minutes before presentation of awards to allow time for protests to be considered. Time of posting should be noted on the Master Score Sheet and an announcement that Results are posted. Riders should have their sheets at this time to check. After 30 minutes, no further protests will be considered.

Qualifying for State Event:

Riders need to score 55% or better in a round to gain a qualifying result, and **Q** should then be placed next to their name on the result sheet for that round. In the example above, only Becky and Harry would have a **Q** beside their names.

Results must be forwarded to PCQ within 7 days of the event. Age Champion

 Overall age champion: Equality of overall awards are decided by average over the number of rounds. If still equal then go back to the highest percentage in the round with the task. In a State event where two rounds have a task the average of the two rounds is used.

TEAM COMPETITION- Scoring as per Zone and State Teams

Scoring of Zone and State teams where groups are combined according to PCQ combined Groups please refer to pg 62 in this document. (20)

A separate score sheet should be used with riders listed in clubs/zones (See Diagram 5 - Page 10).

- A Team is selected from the four best scorers all belonging to one club or zone with the three best scores to count. A team of three is acceptable and may beat a team of 4. Where a club has more than 4 riders, the first team will be the four highest scorers and the second team will commence with the fifth highest scorer. Scores are taken from points awarded for overall placings in Groups/Grades.
- At State Level riders stay in their age groups and within their zone, no composite teams, exception mounted games. ('20)
- 12 & Under Riders (this includes 10 & under) are included in all teams.
- A team with less than 3 riders remaining in competition cannot be placed at all.
- Seniors or riders in unofficial classes are not allowed in teams unless an unofficial competition is held.
- Where there are less than three (3) riders in a competition only first overall place getter is eligible for Team.

SCORING

Scorers receive result sheets (See Diagram 20, page 50) from all events and enter results on a Master Sheet (See Diagram 21, page 51).

Results

Master Score sheets are displayed permanently on the Results Board and brought up to date as often as possible. Times must also be displayed on the Master Score Sheet. Results must be displayed for at least 30 minutes before presentation of awards to allow time for protests to be considered. A time of posting should be recorded on master sheet. No disputes will be considered after this time.

Qualifying Criteria for State Championships:

- Times achieved at previous State Event (or as directed by the Sporting Sub-Committee) are given as a guideline only.
- Rider should be able to achieve times with two (2) seconds of these qualifying times.

Age/Group Champion

Club and Zone Events

Organisers may award points for places as they see fit. The points to be awarded must be on the programme. However, it is recommended that clubs follow the same programme as for the State Championship, i.e. 10 points for 1st descending to 1 point for 10th.

For individual events (eg Rider class) where equal placings occur, the average of the points available for these placings are to be allotted to each rider eg = 2^{nd} : 9 + 8 = 17, 17 ÷ 2 = 8.5pts.

Addition of totals for each competitor should be checked by a second scorer.

In the event of a tie:

- If two or more competitors tie for an individual championship, a countback should be made.
- The competitor with the most wins declared the winner. If still equal, the competitor
 with the most seconds and so on. If equal in every case and a result cannot be
 obtained, a tie should be declared.

<u>Highest Points Club Competition</u>, the Club Scoresheet (See Diagram 22) should be filled out by a third scorer if numbers are large.

Organisers may award points for places as they see fit. The points to be awarded must be on the programme. However, it is recommended that clubs follow the same programme as for the State Championship, i.e., 10 points for 1st descending to 1 point for 10th.

For individual events (e.g., Rider class) where equal placings occur, the average of the points available for these placings are to be allotted to each rider e.g. = 2^{nd} : 9 + 8 = 17, 17 ÷ 2 = 8.5pts.

Addition of totals for each competitor should be checked by a second scorer.

In the event of a tie:

- If two or more competitors tie for an individual championship, a countback should be made.
- The competitor with the most wins declared the winner. If still equal, the competitor with the
 most seconds and so on. If equal in every case and a result cannot be obtained, a tie should
 be declared.

<u>Highest Points Club Competition</u>, the Club Scoresheet (See Diagram 26) should be filled out by a third scorer if numbers are large.

TEAM COMPETITION- Scoring as per Zone and State Teams

Scoring of Zone and State teams where groups are combined according to PCQ combined Groups please refer to pg 62 in this document. (20)

A separate score sheet should be used with riders listed in clubs/zones (See Diagram 5 - Page 10).

- A Team is selected from the four best scorers all belonging to one club or zone with the three best scores to count. A team of three is acceptable and may beat a team of 4. Where a club has more than 4 riders, the first team will be the four highest scorers and the second team will commence with the fifth highest scorer. Scores are taken from points awarded for overall placings in Groups/Grades.
- At State Level riders stay in their age groups and within their zone, no composite teams, exception mounted games. ('20)
- 12 & Under Riders (this includes 10 & under) are included in all teams.
- A team with less than 3 riders remaining in competition cannot be placed at all.
- Seniors or riders in unofficial classes are not allowed in teams unless an unofficial competition is held.
- Where there are less than three (3) riders in a competition only first overall place getter is eligible for Team.

CAMPDRAFT and STOCKMANS CHALLENGE

Overall Placings to 10th at State Events (Aug 19) ('20)

OBJECT OF CAMPDRAFTING

The object is to select a beast in the camp, quietly draft it from the mob, bring it to the face of the camp, prove that you are able to hold it there and when ready, proceed to drive and direct the beast around the course. The main objective is to control the beast as close to the course as possible. That is, direct to, and close to, the pegs.

PRIOR PREPARATION FOR ORGANISERS

Obtain approval of programme from Zone Chief Instructor.

- Obtain necessary score sheets may be obtained from PCAQ (See Diagram 23 & Diagram 24)
- · Appoint Judge in Chief
- Ensure that course complies with PCAQ measurements etc.
- Note that Pony Club rules override where there may be any conflict
- Provide Penciller to write scores as called by Judge

Qualifying Criteria for State Championships:

- Rider to have obtained two (2) outside scored of 60+ on any horse.
- Performance card to show name of judge and number of competitors.
- Stockman's Challenge-Rider to have competed in two (2) Stockman's Challenge competitions (either Pony Club or non-pony club)

SCORING

Individual Age Group Champion

- Scorer should enter scores for each rider as they are given and total score for round.
- If the rider only receives a cut-out score, and no score for outside work, this is carried over into the total for that round.
- Where two rounds are held, the two scores are added together and the total of the two scores will be the result.
- In the case of one round and a final, those with only a cut-out score in the first round and taken into the final round to fill the necessary placings, cannot be placed above those with an outside score in the first round. **Place an asterisk in Total column
- Note: Riders receive points only for their actual placing in their age groups, regardless of whether riders from another State place higher in the group e.g. 1st -Qld (10 pts), 2nd - NSW, 3rd - Qld (8 pts).

In the event of a tie for Individual Competitions:

• Refer to Page 16 Campdraft rulebook. ('20)

MOUNTED GAMES

The object of Mounted Games is to provide the members of pony club with an opportunity to compete on good and well-trained ponies. The games will encourage the young riders to train their ponies to be obedient and themselves to become active and practical horsemen and women, who will compete with enthusiasm and determination. The Games foster team spirit and co-operation between riders.

PRIOR PREPARATION FOR ORGANISERS

- Select Games and provide necessary equipment of each game
- Appoint a Judge in Chief
- Appoint necessary Line Stewards
- Obtain score sheets may be obtained from PCAQ (See Diagram 25).

SCORING

- Points will be awarded on the basis of one in excess of the number of teams competing eg.
 in a four team competition, points will be 5/4/3/ and 2. One point for elimination, 0 points for
 disqualification.
- In the event of elimination for any reason, or failure to complete the race, the team/s will be placed last of those competing and receive points for that place.
- In the event of equality for the final placings a "Tie Breaker" game will be used to decide. This game will be selected in advance and be one of those being used in the Competition. Each Team Coach will select a game. These will then go into a draw the one drawn being the one selected.

The Chief Scorer keeps the score on the official sheet and immediately marks the results on a Master Score Sheet left on the score board. (See Diagram 25, page 25)

Disqualification of a team is only used when it is considered by the Chief Judge that there has been dangerous riding, deliberate interference, or unseemly behaviour. ('20) At the discretion of the Judge in Chief, disqualification may be from the event or concerned or from the whole competition. In the case of disqualification, no team points will be scored.

MULTIPLE EVENT OR "SHIELD" COMPETITIONS

Several Zones hold competitions where points are accumulated over several different disciplines to find a final winner of a perpetual trophy for the year. A rider hoping to win this trophy has to compete at all the different events, usually dressage, showjumping, gymkhana and possibly ODE, Jumping Equitation or Campdraft.

In the past, difficulties and complaints have arisen over the method of carrying forward points from one event to another, and the necessity not to have one discipline unfairly weighted points wise over another.

For such events the following points should be followed:

- All events should carry the same scoring.
- The overall winner of any age, group or grade should receive 10 points, 2nd 9 points and so on down to 1 point for 10th place.
- Thus, the maximum points obtainable for any discipline will be 10.
- <u>In the event of a tie:</u> where two or more riders having the same score after all competitions have been run, the following procedure will determine the winner: -
- A countback should be made and the competitor with the most wins (i.e., 10 points awarded) declared the winner. If still equal, the most seconds (i.e., 9 pts) and so on. If equal in every case and therefore a result cannot be obtained, a tie should be declared.

For the purpose of Highest overall champion award where applicable and zone and State Team awards the combined rule for State events apply. Refer to explanation that follows.

Groups with less than three (3) riders except for straight dressage will be run as per a combined scoring system. Combined groups to award individual points.

Combined Training

e.g.-In the C1 class there is 1 rider, in the C2 there are 2 riders, the C3 class there is 1 rider and in the C4 class there is 1 rider and so they are combined. The group is now called the C1, C2, C3 and C4 combined group. The winner of each C1, C2, C3 and C4 group still will receive their award (eg rug) but the points each rider take forward into the team competition or the overall highest points competition (where applicable) has come from where they have finished in the combined group. In the group of 5 riders the winner will take 10 points into the team event, 2nd place 9 points and so on.

Horse Trails

Eg-In the 2* there is one rider and in the 1* there are 3 riders. The group is now called the 1*/2* combined group. They ride the <u>same</u> dressage test but jump their own height XC and the same SJ course at their own height. The 1 * winner will still receive their award and the winner of the 2* will still receive their award but the points each rider take forward into the team competition or the overall highest points competition (where applicable) has come from where they have finished in the combined group. In the group of 4 riders the winner will take 10 points into the team event, 2nd place 9 points and so on.

Showjumping

e.g.- In the 1.20m there are 2 riders and 2 riders in the 1.10m. The group is now called the 1.10m/1.20m combined group. They will still receive their individual points for placings depending where they finish in each competition in the combined group although they have jumped their respective heights the course remains the same. The overall winner of the 1.10m will still receive their award and the overall winner of the 1.20m will still receive their award but the placing points each rider take forward into the team competition has come from where they have finished in the combined group. In the group of 4 riders the winner will take 10 points into the team event, 2nd place 9 points and so on. For the overall highest points competition (where applicable) it is the points they have accumulated for each group in the combined group. Eg- 4 riders in the combined group: Rider 1 in 1.20m received a 3rd, 2nd and a 4th- total points=24 points carried forward to overall highest points award.

Rider 2 in the 1.20m received a 2^{nd} , 1^{st} and a 3^{rd} = 27 points carried forward to overall highest points award.

Rider 3 in the 1.10m received a 1^{st} , 3^{rd} and a 2^{nd} =27 points carried forward to overall highest points award.

Rider 4 in the 1.10m received a 4^{th} , 4^{th} and. 1^{st} =26 points carried forward to overall highest points award.

For the zone and State teams that would make:

Rider 1-7 points

Rider 2- 10 points-determined as per equality of points for individual champion Rider 3- 9 points - determined as per equality of points for individual champion Rider 4- 8 points

Jumping Equitation

e.g.- In the 17-21 age group there are 4 riders and in the 21-26 group there are 2 riders. The group is now called the 17-21/21-26 combined group. They will still receive their individual points for placings depending where they finish in each competition in the combined group over the same 80cm course with the same judges. The overall winner of the 17-21 will still receive their award and the overall winner of the 21-26 will still receive their award but the points each rider take forward into the team competition has come from where they have finished in the combined group. In the group of 6 riders the winner will take 10 points into the team event, 2nd place 9 points and so on. For the overall highest points competition (where applicable) it is the placing points they have accumulated for each round in the combined group. Eg- 6 riders in the combined group:

Zone Teams and State Teams

- A Team is selected from the four best scorers all belonging to one club or zone with the three
 best scores to count. A team of three is acceptable and may beat a team of 4. Where a club
 has more than 4 riders, the first team will be the four highest scorers and the second team will
 commence with the fifth highest scorer. Scores are taken from points awarded for overall
 placings in Groups/Grades.
- At State Level riders stay in their age groups and within their zone, no composite teams, exception mounted games. ('20)
- 12& Under Riders (this includes 10 & under) are included in all teams.
- A team with less than 3 riders remaining in competition cannot be placed at all.
- Where there are less than three (3) riders in a competition only first overall place getter is eligible for Team.

Minimum Number of Competitors in a Class

There must be at least 3 competitors in a class for teams points to be awarded. If there is less than 3 riders in a class then only the first placed competitor will receive teams points.

To convert a rider's overall Class placings to team points using the 10 to 1 scale: ie overall 1st then 10 points, overall 2nd the 9 points etc.

This shall apply only to straight dressage. Eg- Only 2 elementary riders, therefore only 1st overall gets team points. For all other disciplines see explanation on combined groups above. ('20)

Dressage

3 individual competitions are allocated a % and then points 10 for 1st all the way to 1point for 10th. Competitors with an equal percentage will be placed equal.

Maximum overall placing points is 30.

Zone Teams- Dressage

Best 3 individual scores to count.

For teams convert all overall placings points to team points. Eg- the Preliminary winner had 25 placing points which converts to 10 team points.

Maximum score for a team 30.

Equality of team members- e.g.- 2 members in a team are on 8 points.

- Highest overall placing points
- If still equal highest average percentage over the 3 dressage tests.
- If still equal then the rider who is competing in the higher grade or age group.

Equality of Teams - an equality of zone teams on points:

- Highest overall placing points
- If still equal highest average percentage Average the average percentages of the 3 highest scoring riders in a team.

State Team – Dressage

The 4 riders with the highest team points will form the team.

- 1. If equal Highest overall placing points from the 3 tests. E.g. 30 points to 1 point
- 2. If still equal Average percentage over all tests

State Jumping Equitation and Showjumping Championships- In the case of an equality best performance in the showjumping discipline will decide the winner. If still equal then the rider in the higher showjumping height. (20)

<u>State Dressage. Combined Training and Horse trials Championships-</u> In the case of an equality best performance in the horse trials discipline will decide the winner. If still equal then the rider in the higher horse trials height. (20)

State Sporting. Formal Gymkhana. Campdrafting. Stockmans Challenge Championships Awarded to the rider (12yrs and over) in 4 disciplines (sporting gymkhana, formal gymkhana, campdrafting and stockman's challenge). In the case of an equality best performance in the campdraft discipline will decide the winner. If still equal then the rider in the older age group. (20)

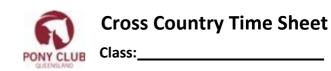
