First Aid Courses:

A survey was conducted late last year to ascertain if clubs currently have qualified first aid officers. To assist clubs with ensuring they have the required first aid officers as required as per the PCA Minimum Medical Standards, PCQ has submitted an application for funding under the Active Industry Project

Fund to enable up to 160 members from our affiliated clubs to attend a HLTAID011 first aid course, in an online format conducted through the First Aid Online.

The course is completed through a self-paced online pre course, which covers all of the training and testing for the course. The candidate attends a pre booked zoom session, where an instructor will talk the candidate through all of the practical components of the course using training equipment that is posted out.

We are currently waiting on whether our funding application is successful and if so, PCQ will circulate a registration form to clubs to have their designated candidate complete and return this form.

The Secretary advised the meeting that the Active Clubs Round 3 is now open and provides funding of \$2500 to strengthen volunteer capacity and provide a variety of safe participation opportunities. Club could access this funding to provide first aid courses. Applications close 5:00pm Wednesday 1st March 2023.

iSponsor:

PCQ has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with iSponsor who is a shopping gateway that serves as a fundraising and sponsorship platform for groups and businesses. iSponsor currently has a group of businesses registered including businesses in small communities that provides a percentage of a purchase back to a designated club. The process being, every time a member shops at a registered business a percentage goes back to the club whether the purchase is conducted online or in person. A webinar is currently being developed by iSponsor and will be available shortly for participation/viewing.

Management Committee Meetings:

Presenters/Presentations:

Moving forward, the Executive is looking to engage suitable presenters to provide relevant & topical presentations of up to 30 minutes to the Management Committee prior to the commencement of the Management Committee meeting. This does not necessarily mean this will occur at every meeting.

The meeting was briefed on how this would be conducted with the guest speaker and/or presentation taking 15 minutes or so with any questions to be emailed through to the office. Furthermore, any suggestion on topics for presentation would be welcomed.

A couple of topics raised by the delegates being:

- · Councils & ground leases
- Membership; adult riders

The President agreed these issues are of significant interest to clubs and that and advice would be beneficial.

Scheduled Meeting Dates:

The meeting schedule for the 2023 PCQ Management Committee meetings has been circulated to zones and delegates. Agendas will be forwarded no later than the Tuesday preceding the scheduled meeting. If a delegate is unable to attend the meeting, please ensure you send through an apology to enable it to be recorded in the minutes.

PCQ Rule Books:

The Executive discussed the timeline for the updating of rule books and resolved that the rule books be available and enacted by the 31st January each year. The Executive further acknowledge those personnel who update the rules books are volunteers and there is a lot of detailed work involved.

PCQ 2023 Membership:

A reminder that proof of club membership is required when nominating and competing and riders attending muster/rally must be a 2023 current financial member of have completed and paid the "Come N Try" or "Day Participation" forms. An ePCQ publication has been circulated to all members advising of this requirement.

Proficiency Certificates:

The Executive at their January meeting approved the introduction of an administration fee of \$15 per application for the marking and processing of assessment papers for Certificates C, C*, K, B and A effective 1st January 2023. PCQ has appointed designated co-ordinators to mark these papers to ensure there is transparency and consistency in marking of the assessment papers. Just for "C" certificate alone there were over 100 assessment papers submitted for marking during 2022.

PCQ State Formal Gymkhana Showjumping:

The Executive at their January meeting accepted the recommendation from the CIP that the State Formal Gymkhana Showjumping is to be conducted as an Official event with the final jump off against the clock.

Campdrafting Age Group:

The Executive at their January meeting resolved to accept the recommendation that the CIP are against the introduction of under 12 State Campdrafting age group following assessment and exposure to unacceptable risk.

Hot Weather:

Due to the heat wave conditions we have recently experienced, this is a timely reminder to zones & clubs to ensure they are aware of and abide by the PCA Hot Weather and Horse Welfare Policies. Again, an ePCQ publication has been circulated to all members as this not only affects riders but our horses as well.

FairPlay Website:

Round 8 of the FairPlay vouchers is currently open for parents, carers or guardians to apply for a voucher valued up to \$150 for their child, which can be used towards sport and active recreation membership, registration or participation fees with <u>registered activity providers (Opens in new window)</u>. There is a limit of 1 voucher per child per calendar year.

The FairPlay website has been updated and clubs need to ensure they are registered on the new website as registered activity providers to ensure they can redeem the FairPlay vouchers.

PCA:

PCA/States Representatives Meeting

PCQ was represented by the President & Vice President Geoff Thomson at the November meeting where the following was discussed:

- Day Insurance states to report on number of day members as part of insurance return
- Relevant Persons reinforce the need to ensure that parents and supporters that attend pony club R) events and rallies/musters are also members. Further information on who is a "relevant person" is required in order to understand the importance that regular attendees are members. Volunteers expecting to be covered by insurance must be identified and known. More to come from PCA Integrity Manager.
- Discipline Committees 2023 PCA is refreshing the membership of the PCA National Discipline Committees and moving to a skills-based model.
- Participation Pathways for Riding Centre Members seeking further information on transition of riding centre members to club members. To be further discussed at next meeting.
- Adult Members: successful membership models for adults to be further discussed at next meeting.
- PCA Nationals 2023 Western Australia is the host state

Medical Services Framework:

The National Safety Committee has revised the Minimum Medical Standards for 2023 and the revised framework is on the PCA website at:

Renewing Membership on JustGo:

- To access the JustGo database pca.justgo
- The User name for every PCQ member is the membership number (ID)
- Renewing members no longer require club approval.
 New members do require approval and can be found in Summary by Membership > Summary by Club Member Status
- Transfers also require approval and can be found under Club Members > Membership > Transfer Requests
- Please do not join as a Centre Member only, if you do you are not a current member of PCQ and will need to go to PCA to have the membership deleted and monies refunded before you can join pony club this year.

2023 Waiver Forms:

Individual Member Agreement will be a compulsory field when joining or renewing membership on JustGo.

PCA will load the member waiver on Just Go and the member will also be required to acknowledge compliance with the PCA National Integrity Framework as a mandatory requirement for joining or renewal.

Day Participant Event Waiver and Liability Declaration is on the PCQ website – Resources – Forms – Clubs and has replaced the Open Day Liability Dec and Open Day Waiver. To be filled out and signed by any non-financial PCQ rider and Come and Try Day Participants https://ponyclubqld.com.au/wp-content/uploads/2022/12/Day-Participant-Event-Waiver-and-Liability-Declaration-Pony-Club-Australia.pdf

Individual Member Event Waiver and Liability Declaration will be a compulsory field on any online nominations set up through JustGo.

If using Nominate or any other event software for online nominations, the Waiver will need to be incorporated in the setup as a compulsory field. Secretary advised that Nominate has been asked to do this and it will be an automatic inclusion in programmes which are Pony Club.

For any other competitions e.g., Gymkhana, Campdraft etc. the Waiver must be handed in with the Horse Health Dec prior to the commencement of the competition.

Clubs/Zones will be advised to note this on their programs and keep a supply on hand on the day of competition.

Please note the Individual Event Waiver is not required on Muster/Rally Days.

In the JustGo database under the State "Come & Try" Membership a fee of \$20 has been Activated - Come & Try includes Open Competition Days.

Vouchers for Membership: – are now available through Sport and Rec.

There are two ways these vouchers can be used

The members join and pays, the voucher is given to the club to redeem and the member is reimbursed

The member gives the voucher to the club, the club joins the member and redeems the voucher. Please Note the vouchers cannot be used by Queensland members through JustGo

Paying the \$20 Affiliation Fee on JustGo:

Go to My Club > Affiliation > and follow the prompts.

Query as to whether the signature was required on the form as it can be difficult to get if in remote areas. The President advised the form can be signed on behalf of the Secretary if need be.

Horse Registrations:

There are two (2) options available for Horse registrations.

Option 1: JustGo database through the rider's profile. The steps are:

- Click on Credentials
- Add new select horse registration from drop down options
- Ensure the "Official" box is ticked if performance cards are required
- As there is no payment option attached to horse registrations, payment to be made by either calling the office with credit card details or a direct deposit into the PCQ bank account.

Option 2: Complete the Horse Registration Application Form which is located on the PCQ website at: Resources > Forms > General.

Payment options are on this form.

Clubs and Zones running Official Events in February may allow riders to compete competitively without producing their performance cards, providing they can prove they have applied for the card. There is a huge backlog which is being addressed as quickly as possible, Australia Post is very slow and it doesn't help when members leave it a few days out from a competition to ask for a horse to be registered.

Official Programs and Gymkhana/Sporting/Campdraft or Open Day Programs:

All Official programs must be sent in to PCQ for approval, once the program has been approved it will be posted on the PCQ website and can be circulated. Prior to the competition a list of all Officials/Judges must also be forwarded to PCQ for approval.

Any other program must be approved by the Zone Chief Instructor prior to circulation

Open Days – Clubs need to ensure Open Day Advice Form for Competitions, Clinics etc has been signed by the Zone Secretary prior to forwarding to PCQ.
