PCQ Smoking Policy

This policy has been updated and circulated to zones and clubs and uploaded onto the PCQ website. Clubs are able to contact the Qld Health Department to procure appropriate signage for display at their clubs.

Horse Welfare Policy - Manage Breaches

PCQ has created a form for reporting of horse welfare policy breaches. This JotForm link has been circulated to zones and clubs and a PCQ eNews advice will also be forwarded to members shortly.

Fire Ants Eradication Plan - Update

PCQ received an invitation to attend a briefing on the fire ant response plan 2023-27 of which PCQ was represented by Jillian Bird (Zone 2 President).

The program's new containment band forms a horseshoe around the infestation, spanning from Moreton Bay in the north, west to the Lockyer Valley, east to the Gold Coast, and south to the Tweed Shire. Eradication treatment will be conducted in a 10 km strip that wraps around the inside of the containment band.

The first areas to receive eradication treatment will be suburbs comprising parts of Southern Downs, Scenic Rim, and City of Gold Coast local government areas. Teams will begin eradication treatment this month and 100% of all properties in the target area must be treated whether fire ants are visible or not.

The treatment that is used is safe for humans and animals and is approved by the Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority (APVMA).

Properties will receive up to 3 rounds of treatment between September 2023 and June 2024.

The Fire Ant Eradication officers are authorised under the *Biosecurity Act 2014* to access all properties for the purpose of eradicating fire ants. Refusing access or obstructing these officers in any way is considered a breach of the *Biosecurity Act 2014* and penalties can apply.

The latest update from DAF has been circulated to clubs in zones 2 and 3. It is highly recommended this document be read in full.

203.09.15 General Business:

Casual Vacancy Vice President - the President reiterated that the Executive will address the casual vacancy at its next Executive meeting.

2024 fees – query confirming fees set at the AGM.

Promotion – a lengthy discussion ensued on how to promote pony club going forward, with a general consensus that a 'focus group' be established. The President reiterated the importance of this focus group and the need to conduct an audit of clubs to gather relevant statistics. It was also suggested that younger pony clubbers be represented.

The meeting was advised, that PCQ at the next PCA/State Representative meeting will once again raise the promotion of pony club on a nationwide level.

Across the State - The President sought comment on activities from the following areas:

South – Zone 1 Delegate noted a reduction in numbers at competitions, that the standard has declined and is not the same. Perhaps need to adopt the concept to look at within the regions for working groups e.g., idea fest; look at clubs doing well, what is working for them and the regions bring back this data to the state body.

On a positive note, while numbers may be down, the comradery is great and the children are having a fantastic time

Far North – Zone 18 Delegate advised they were busy with SCI medals candidates, zone junior rallies, gymkhanas have been good this year with all clubs have managed to hold them despite the weather. Masters' gymkhana in the zone and keeping pony club fun. Pre-school for new & younger coaches, zone gymkhana & championships introduced with something to aim for at the end of the year.

Central – VP Tracey Camilleri advised that everything has slowed down for showjumping, eventing & dressage and that not a lot of sporting is being conducted. Pony club camps conducted in school holidays as it's important to give the camp experience. Gymkhanas are ramping up, zone rallies happening and encompassing riders from different clubs. Archery was popular and held at camp the last few years.

The President closed the meeting at 8.46 pm and thanked the delegates for their attendance and engagement and extended PCQ's best wishes and safe travel to those going to Western Australia for the National Championships. The next meeting is scheduled for Thursday 2nd November 2023 commencing at 7:00pm.
