A Horse Health Declaration including PIC details will be required to be produced for each horse attending before admittance to the venue will be granted.

Please note that Taroom is a TICK FREE AREA.

Documents for moving stock from a place in Queensland cattle tick Infected Zone (stock includes Horses).

- 1. QLD Travel Permit.
- 2. QLD Livestock Movement System Move Easy Waybill.

Conditions of the Travel Permit

- 1. Owner or person in charge of the stock MUST be aware of all the conditions of the Travel Permit.
- 2. Movement by direct conveyance to and from the venue and must be completed within 5 days of entry into the grounds.
- 3. A Fully completed Waybill/NVD with Travel Permit Details endorsed must accompany the stock.
- 4. Stock must be treated by either.
 - a) Accredited Tick Control Personnel in the infected zone or
 - b) The owner in complying with the Schedule of Conditions of the Competitive Stock Owner Treatment Scheme.
 - c) Inspector of Stock or Approved Person.

STABLES:

- Manure to be put in designated areas
- All stables/yards will be allocated. Anyone moving stables/yards without express permission of the stabling manager will be in breach of the biosecurity plan and will be asked to leave the grounds.
- Stables/yards must the left clean on departure free of manure, urine, sodden sawdust and feed.

All soiled bedding **must** be removed from stables to the allocated area for pick up at the conclusion of the event. A stable bond will not be charged however if stables are not cleaned out competitors/Zones will be charged accordingly.

CAMPING: Camping areas are to be left clean and free of rubbish.

DOGS - Please be advised that if you have a dog they must be kept away from the competition, yarding, exercise and canteen areas and kept on a leash and under control at all times. When tied up, dogs must not be able to move outside the perimeter of the vehicle.

QUALIFYING CRITERIA FOR STATE EVENTS 2024

Qualifying period: The twelve (12) months following the close of nominations from the previous State Event

PLEASE NOTE: All Riders wishing to compete at State Events, are required to hold, by close of nominations, the following accreditations:

Under 13 Years: Either PCA D Proficiency Certificate or Copper State Chief Instructor's Medal. 13 years and Over: Either PCA C Proficiency Certificate or Bronze State Chief Instructor's Medal.

A photocopy of the Certificate/Medal Certificate will be required with the nomination.

Sporting:

Times achieved at previous State Event (or as directed by the Sporting Sub-Committee) are given as a Guideline only. The rider should be able to achieve times within two (2) seconds of these qualifying times. There will be no "pending" for any State Event.

 $\textbf{Formal Gymkhana}: Top \ five \ (5) \ placing \ at \ a \ Formal \ Gymkhana \ run \ by \ a \ Club \ or \ top \ ten \ (10) \ placing \ at \ Zone.$

There will be no "pending" for any State Event.

Campdraft:

- 1. Must be 11 years of age or older.
- 2. Qualifying events are Pony Club or non-Pony Club competitions
- 3. Obtaining 2 scores of 60 plus at a campdraft in the previous 12 months And/Or
- 4. Competed at 2 Stockman's Challenge competitions and received 2 outside scores in the cattle work section
- 5. Riders must supply a legible copy of both sides of their performance card when nominating and produce the card at the event showing they have satisfied the criteria in point 2 above.
- 6. Achievements meeting the criteria obtained at the previous year's State event are eligible as one qualifier.
- 7. Whether rider/horse combination qualifies has no bearing on their places on the day.
- 8. Where a riders age necessitates going up an age group before the State Championships, horse & rider Combinations who have qualified as above will be considered qualified to compete at the new level. Anyone going up an age after the close of nominations, previous qualifications will be accepted.

Additional criteria which apply to All Disciplines:

- 1. To count as a Qualifying Event, Zone Championships must be run in the same format as a State Event and have been applied for and approved by the relevant PCQ Sub-Committee.
- 2. All riders nominating must have attended at least TWO musters (rallies) in the past twelve months at their club or previous club in the case of transfers or club where they are attending as an 'honorary' member because of school or work commitments.
- 3. Zone Secretary and/or Zone Delegate to check qualifying criteria have been met, copy of proficiency certificate or State CI Medal Certificate attached, attendance requirements verified, before sending in nominations. Club Secretary to check all requirements for nomination are complete and correct before forwarding to zone. Riders to complete nomination correctly as incomplete forms will be returned. If nominations are done online, after close of nominations, the State Championship's Organising Secretary Is to send a list of competitors, horse and events to each Zone Secretary to check qualifying criteria are met and attendance requirements verified, with the assistance of the relevant Club Secretary. Riders found not to be qualified may be stopped from competing.

4. Extenuating Circumstances

On a case-by-case basis, prior to close of nominations, where there are genuine extenuating circumstances for non-qualifying, rider may apply to a Zone Committee made up of Zone Chief Instructor, Zone President and/or Secretary plus the discipline delegate to the PCQ Sub-Committee; however this does not apply to the Certificate/SCI Medal requirement. This committee will consider, agree and recommend whether or not the rider/horse combination is of sufficient standard to compete.

5. Injured horse or substitution of horse

Refer Extenuating Circumstances above. The same Zone Committee - being satisfied that the horse originally qualified and nominated is unable to compete - would approve any substitution of horse after due consideration and agreement on whether such horse is of sufficient standard to compete in its nominated group.

6. Special Consideration

Where a 12 & Under rider will move to graded competition after the close of nomination, he/she will be allowed to ride HC (taking part in all second rounds as applicable) in the new grade for up to 3 months preceding turning 13 years to gain experience at the new level prior to the State Event.

1. RULES

All competitions will run according to PCQ rules. It is not feasible to print all the rules and regulations pertaining to a competition on a schedule. Team Managers and competitors are expected to be familiar with all applicable rules of PCQ.

BACK NUMBERS

The Zone Team Manager will be responsible for the collection and return of back numbers. Back numbers not returned at the end of competition will be billed to Zones at \$100 per bib.

ORDER OF START

Competitors will ride in order of the draw. The draw will be in the program and available at the event.

4. ENTRY

Incorrect or misleading information will incur elimination. Zones will receive notification of your nomination. If your zone disagrees with the accuracy of the information in your nomination, or they have any reason why they do not support you representing them at this state championship, your nomination will be refused, and your money refunded.

5. ZONES

Zone secretaries will be required to confirm support of the list of nominees for their zone. They will also need to provide contact details for zone team managers.

6. FIXTURE

Shall be defined as one program held on one or more days by one Organising Committee. The one horse/one rider rule will apply. Riders may change horses between events (Dec 97). (PCQ rule 19 Mounts in general rules applies)

7. ZONE TEAM MANAGER

Each Zone will appoint a Team Manager. His/Her duties shall be:

- Responsible for all team members whilst at the event
- Inspect uniforms and gear of competitors before they report to gear steward.
- Responsible for lodging of protest, which must be made in writing within 30 minutes of the incident or of results being posted accompanied with a \$50 fee.
- Responsible for the back numbers and their return.
- Ensure that zone duties are fulfilled.
- Ensure that all competitors are mounted and present at Presentation.

8. PRESENTATION

For presentation of awards at the conclusion of a state fixture it is the Teams Manager's responsibility to assemble all competitors, mounted in full uniform, ribbon winners or not for the final parade. An unmounted assembly may be organised at the discretion of the committee in extenuating circumstances.

Request for the special permission to leave must be made in writing by the Zone Team Manager and may be granted by the Judge in Chief and the Chief Stewart in exceptional circumstances.

EXERCISE

Competitors may exercise their horses in the areas provided. Horses may be schooled or exercised only by the nominated rider on the day of the competition. Horses may be lunged by the nominated rider, a parent or club instructor, in the designated area.

Riders disregarding this rule could incur a disqualification from the event. Competitors must not ride on or near any part of the official courses prior to the competition. Horses must be correctly saddled, and the competitor must wear a helmet, riding boots and competition number whilst exercising their horse. Helmets to be Equestrian Helmets rated at PCQ standards as stands A/NZ 3838, A/NZ ARB HS 2012, EN1384 & VG01.040, BS PAS 015 or ASTM F1163 or better.

SCORING

Scoring will be in accordance with the scoring handbook and appropriate rule book for each discipline.

11. TEAMS

Riders in all groups will be included in the State and Zone Teams. Refer to scoring handbook for more detailed method of scoring for teams in each discipline.





- Saulte Judge at A
- 2 Walk to B
- 3 Rising trot to C (center). Stop.
- 4 360° spin to the right.
- 5 360° spin to the left.
- 6 Trot a medium circle to the right.
- 7 Trot a medium circle to the left.
- 8 At C canter a large circle to the right on the right lead.
- 9 At C do a simple change and canter a large circle to the left on the left lead.
- 10 At C do a simple change and canter to E on the right lead. Stop.
- 11 Do a rollback to the left and canter to F on the left lead. Stop.
- 12 Do a rollback to the right and canter on the right lead all the way to G and stop.
- 13 Back your horse until you are in line with the judge. Stop.
- 14 Turn and face the judge, salute. Leave arena on a loose rein.
