Class fee is \$25.00 per class, per horse and rider combination.

<u>Late Nomination Processing Fee</u> of \$20.00 per rider will apply for nominations received after close of nominations via Nominate, if late or assistance required or nominations processed through other methods, contact the organising secretary, it is preferred that nominations and payments for all riders to be completed via Nominate. Nominations close prior to event, dates advertised.

Riders are to nominate in the class that suit their horse's ability, however the organizers retain the right to move any horse rider combination to another class as they see fit. Entries capped at 50 riders.

- *All riders must ride in their applicable age group and ability.
- **The Assisted Rider Class is designed to encourage the confidence of riders and young horses, it is open to any age, all helping hands on deck are required to cheer these riders on.
- *All PCQ riders must ride in the age group applicable to their age and ability, may only compete at graded heights if the horse and rider combination has an Official PCQ card for the height nominated/ class nominated, the nominated combination cannot ride above or below their graded height. Combined classes of various heights will be judged and placed on their individual performance within the class nominated. Riders may compete 2 horses under PCQ Rule Book. Unsound horses will be scratched from competition.

Refund: No refunds of nominations after the close of entries via nominate, unless scratching is made prior to the event and a written request for a refund, including a medical or vet certificate is received within 7 days of event. A 20% admin fee applies. For PCA riders the same rules apply and/or Chief Instructors Report, all refunds are at the discretion of the committee upon requirements being submitted.

<u>Protests and disputes</u> are to be lodged within half hour of class end with a fee of \$50.00 and within 30 minutes after results are announced.

Horses and/or riders that are not nominated to participate in the event and have not completed and paid nominations/ fees/ Declarations are not permitted to ride or work horses on the grounds without prior approval from MDHPC, riders non-compliant with this may be reported to the appropriate regulatory authority and be invoiced appropriate fees, this includes administration fees.

<u>Stewards and Helpers:</u> Riders are required to provide the name and mobile number of a steward/ helper at time of lodging Horse Health Declaration on arrival – DO NOT SUPPLY YOUR OWN NAME! NO HELPER, NO RIDE.

<u>Please note</u>; we are a small club and your assistance is greatly appreciated, rail and jump stewards are required to help run this event smoothly, helpers will be required to attend the briefing applicable to their assigned job and will be notified when they are required, we promise not to take up too much of your time and give you a bird's eye view of the competition, we will cover the rest of the jobs.

<u>Presentation</u> to commence once equipment is stored, many hands make light work. Competitors must be present for presentation and in full uniform or cross-country colours as per PCAQ rulings, or you will be considered scratched and on third call, eliminated.

PCQ GEAR & DRESS RULES APPLY

ALL riders are to be presented in registered club uniform, neat and tidy, sun smart attire, boots, collared shirt and jodhpurs – no jeans. ALL PARTICIPANTS AND SPECTATORS ON THE GROUNDS ARE REQUIRED TO WEAR CLOSED IN SHOES AT ALL TIMES WHEN HANDLING HORSES, ENTERING COMPETITION AND/OR AREAS WHERE HORSES ARE PRESENT.

APPROVED GEAR:

Helmets: AS/NZ3838, EN1384, ASTMF1163, (AU) EN1384 Only for Helmets with manufacturers date up to and including 2015. PAS 015(UK), VGI (EUROPE) or ASTM F1163 (USA) with effective chin strap. Only Approved gear may be used on horse as per PCA Gear Check Handbook, <u>ALL</u> horse and rider combinations must be presented to steward for gear inspection prior to competing or elimination will be incurred.

HORSE HEALTH FORMS AND STABLING

<u>Horse Health Declaration</u> forms <u>must</u> be handed in to office on arrival, failure to comply will result in rider not being able to compete.

<u>Yards & Stabling</u>: Horses are to be stabled in allocated yarding area unless advised/ approved otherwise by committee. Electric fencing must be turned off for the duration of competition, where stabling is no longer available 2 strand electric fencing may be used, an area will be allocated for yards, yards must be constructed of 4 sides and 2 strands. All horses are to be maintained in allocated horse area. Stabling fee is \$15.00 per day.

Stabling & camping deposit will be returned within 14 days on final inspection of yard prior to leaving if yard is of a clean and acceptable state. Stabling & camping deposit of \$50.00 is required prior to use, parking and yards allocation will be notified on submission of Horse Health Declaration. If you are arriving early, please contact for your allocation. Stabling plan is attached to this program. Yards do not have bedding, the use of bedding is permitted, you are required to remove bedding prior to leaving the grounds or you will forfeit stabling deposit.

MPC Waste Management Plan requires all manure to be bagged and tied off, please bring feed bags, manure stations are allocated on grounds and will be collected by committee at end of competition.

PARKING AND CAMPING

Parking and camping allocations may be assigned, and we kindly ask that you park where committee members request, vehicles may need to be parked on the outside of the grounds if high nominations occur. Camping/ Power Fee \$10.00 per day. Hot showers and toilets available, we welcome early arrivals and encourage you to stay an extra night or two to prevent driver fatigue, we believe in keeping you and your horse safe.

No open fires permitted on the grounds, use of fire pits is allowed, you are required to full extinguish fire pit prior to retiring for the night. Camp sites must be left clean, neat, tidy and free of rubbish, stabling & camping deposit will be returned within 14 days on final inspection of area prior to leaving if area is of a clean and acceptable state. Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times.

Yards and Parking areas are numbered for identification of users and will be reserved at time of nominations being received, to assist with improving safety on the grounds, please ensure your details are correct at time of arrival and lodgement of Horse Health declaration. Invoices will be issued to competitors for payment if late nominations have occurred or circumstances where plans have changed and additional stay occurs after the close of nominations on nominate, this is applicable to any fees incurred during your stay on the grounds. Parking plan is attached to this program.

Vehicles are not to be driven or parked on any riding areas without permission of the executive committee, a Maintenance Fee of \$250.00 will be invoiced to repair damage.

CANTEEN

Canteen will be operating on both days of competition, please note payment is by eftpos, cash or prearranged d/d.

Zone 10 payment policy applies to all events held within Zone 10.

Disclaimer: Neither the organizing committee nor PCAQ accept any Liability for accidents damage, injury nor illness to horse, owners, riders, ground spectators or any other person or property whatsoever.

Reservation of Rights: The organizing Committee reserves the right to; cancel any class or event, combine or divide classes according to numbers nominated and the rules governing splitting groups, alter advertised times, transfer competitors between sections of a class and to refuse and entry with or without a reason, amend or cancel all or any part of this program advertised.

RULES:

- Run under PCQ Rule Book. Judges' decision is final.
- Riders may enter two horses in the same or different classes. One horse/one rider rule applies. Maximum 2 horses per rider. Horses must be 4 years or older. No stallions allowed. No riders to ride on grounds unless competing.
- Bad language, excessive striking of the horse, abuse or disrespect to the judge or officials will result in disqualification.
- HORSE HEALTH DECLARATION MUST BE HANDED IN TO THE OFFICE UPON ARRIVAL
- Riders cannot choose to upgrade on the day of the competition. This must be applied for and approved prior to the competition. Riders MUST compete in the class that is on their card.
- Run under PCQ Horse Trials' Rules with the exception of timing devices.
- Hand in Horse Health Declaration on arrival Office closes at 8.40am on morning of competition.
- All riders must wear an approved helmet (AS/NZS 3838, EN 1384 or ASTM F1163) and boots, collared shirt and jodhpurs no jeans. Club uniforms are required for official competitions.

Events run as per PCQ Rule Book. A competitor is ultimately responsible for knowing these rules and complying with them.

<u>Photographer</u> for this event will be announced on the Facebook page prior to the commencement of event. You may take photos of your own child, but please respect the fact that we do have a professional photographer who invests a huge amount of time in covering our events and refrain from taking photos of other riders <u>when competing</u>. We also ask that no other photographers take photos to sell or promote themselves – thank you for your understanding.

BIOSECURITY FACT SHEET

We take biosecurity seriously and have measures in place to mitigate the risk of infections, diseases and pests.

OUR BIOSECURITY POLICY

All horse owners and competitors should be aware that you have a biosecurity obligation to take all reasonable steps to ensure your activities do not spread a pest, disease or contaminant.

Competitors are asked to ensure good biosecurity practices at home and at the event and to follow the instructions of the organising committee and the Biosecurity Manager or risk expulsion from the event.

All horses entering grounds must be from a property actively practicing good biosecurity principles within their management.

Horse Health Declarations (HHD) are a mandatory requirement for all events. Please read the HHD form and ensure:

- Your horses are shampooed, rinsed and allowed to dry, and their hooves are picked clean of all solid material and washed with shampoo
- Your vehicles and equipment accompanying the horses are cleaned to remove all solid material that could contain disease agents, and then disinfected

Acceptance into the event will be refused if the required HHD is not presented at point of entry or designated registration point, as advised by the organising committee.

The property identification code (PIC) of the horse's origin must be included on the HHD

Other biosecurity and workplace health and safety measures that aim to provide the safest environment for horses, competitors, volunteers and visitors include:

- No horses or dogs with signs of illness are to be brought onto the grounds.
- No communal horse water troughs are available at this event.
- Do not share equipment, including food and water containers, between horses.
- Competitors are responsible for cleaning up and bagging manure from yards and any other area and placing it in designated areas. Please use your own rakes/shovels.
- Competitors are required to advise the event organisers immediately if a horse is sick. Stop all nonessential contact with the sick horse. Do not allow children to have close contact with the sick horse.
- Everyone handling horses should wash or sanitize hands between contacting different horses.

OUR BIOSECURITY PLAN

Our event biosecurity plan is a set of preventative control measures and actions aimed at reducing the risk of infectious diseases and pests on and off the venue, and between horses at the venue.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE UNLIKELY EVENT OF A BIOSECURITY INCIDENT

- In the unlikely event of a biosecurity incident, the Biosecurity Manager and the organizing committee will implement our event biosecurity plan.
 - You will be notified about the incident and expected to follow the directions given by the organizing committee.
- Everyone will be expected to remain at the venue until cleared to leave by the organising committee and Biosecurity Manager.
- In the event of horse movement restrictions participants are responsible for the care, maintenance and cost of their horses and themselves, including feeding, bedding, vets and personal needs.
- If a horse is confirmed to have an infectious disease the owner/ lessee will be responsible for all vet cost and, if venue is locked down and quarantined, will be responsible for all cost associated with this,




