## GENERAL REGULATIONS

The Organising Committee reserves the right to alter, amend, combine, or delete any part of the program if circumstances arise which make it necessary.

#### ALL COMPETITORS

The Rider's age is determined as of 1 January 2025.

- Sub Junior: riders under 13 years of age. Must be a member of a Pony Club affiliated with Pony Club Australia
- Junior: riders 13 years and under 17 years of age. Must be a member of a Pony Club affiliated with Pony Club Australia
- Senior: riders 17 years and under 25 years of age. Must be a member of a Pony Club affiliated with Pony Club Australia
- Open: Rider under 81 years old. Must be a member of a Pony Club affiliated with Pony Club Australia
- Master's: 26 years and under 81 years of age. Must be a member of a Pony Club affiliated with Pony Club Australia. Results from
  - Master's will not contribute to the Roger Braham OAM Perpetual Shield point score.
- PCA Accredited Riding Centre member: any age, Class may be split into age group depending on numbers.
  - Results from these classes will not contribute to the Roger Braham OAM Perpetual Shield point score. DRESSAGE
     ONLY
- Rider with All Abilities: Class may be split into age group depending on numbers. Results from these classes will
  not contribute to the Roger Braham OAM Perpetual Shield point score. DRESSAGE ONLY
- Para rider: Para riders by FEI/EA graded definition, Class may be split into age group depending on numbers. Results from these classes will not contribute to the Roger Braham OAM Perpetual Shield point score. DRESSAGE ONLY

## NOTE RIDERS CAN ONLY ENTER 1 OF EITHER RIDING CENTRE, PARA OR ALL ABILITIES CLASS

Quiz - Must be a member of a Pony Club affiliated with Pony Club Australia – Can be Riding or non-riding member.

#### **Teams**

- Each State/Territory is permitted to enter a minimum of 3 and a maximum six riders in each age group in Dressage, Eventing, Showjumping, Formal Gymkhana
- Each State/Territory is permitted to enter four riders in each age group in Male & Female classes in Tetrathlon
- Each State/Territory is permitted to enter a team of 5 riders in the Mounted games teams event, and a max of 3 pairs (6 riders) in the Mounted Games pairs event
- Each State/Territory is permitted to enter four riders in each age group in Quiz
- Teams to be a minimum of three and a maximum of six
- A minimum of three states are required to compete to constitute a PCA National Team Championship event, otherwise the event will become a competition for individuals only.
- Points for team are accumulated from each event as listed in the program.
- All competitors will be scored for individual championships
- A mounted presentation will be held for each discipline.
- Uniform is to be the competitor's State uniform.

## **Individuals**

- All competitors in each event will be scored for the Individual Championships.
- Riding Centre, All abilities and Para dressage classes are individual championships only

## ALL DISCIPLINES

- One Rider per Horse. -Horses may enter 2 disciplines but must be with the same rider. (exception Tet riders are permitted to borrow a horse that is already ridden by another competitor in a different discipline for the ridden phase of Tet, however this would count as a discipline for this horse and horses may only compete in 2 disciplines)
- Riders are permitted to enter 2 horses in different disciplines only if states/territory cannot fill all team positions.
- For all disciplines, if distance prohibits the competitor, borrowed horses are allowed, subject to approval by the rider's home State and the PCA Organising Committee by close of entries.
  - Horses may participate in a maximum of 2 Disciplines.
  - Substitutes due to injury or illness will be at the discretion of each State or Territory up until the commencement of competition of the Discipline entered and the horse must have passed the veterinary check (trot up).
  - Unless otherwise stated in this Program, Pony Club Australia National Rules apply to this event including the Pony

• Swabbing of horses may be carried out randomly at this event.

## PCA NATIONALS - DRESSAGE CHAMPIONSHIP

Team events - Sub Junior/ Junior/ Senior/ Masters/ Open Individual Events - Sub Junior/ Junior/ Senior/ Masters/ Open/All Abilities/ Riding Centre/ Para

A Team is to be a maximum of 6 Riders with the top 3 scores to count.

- Each State/Territory is permitted to enter six riders in each age group
- Teams to be a minimum of three riders and a maximum of six riders in each age group. Top 3 scores to count- all
  riders considered to be the team.
- Points accumulated from each event.
- Where there are insufficient numbers to form a Team, Individual Riders are permitted.
- All Riders will be scored for Individual Championships.
- Individual entry only events Riding Centre/ Special needs/ Para.

- All Riders will be scored for Individual Championships.

- All competitors in each Team form the Team.
- Team members can be riding or non-riding

- Where there are insufficient numbers to form a Team, each State or Territory may enter Individual Riders.
- Points are accumulated from each phase.
- All Riders will be scored for Individual Championships.
- All Riders in each Team form the Team.

#### PCA NATIONALS - FORMAL GYMKHANA CHAMPIONSHIP

Sub Junior/ Junior/ Seniors/ Masters

- Each State or Territory may have a Team of 6 competitors in each age group.
- The top 3 scores in each Team will count.
- Points are accumulated from each event.
- All competitors will be scored for the Individual Championships.
- All competitors in each Team form the Team.
