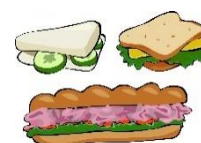

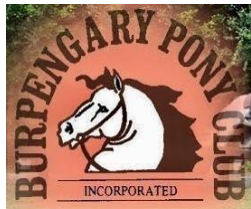

<b>Conditions of Entry – Burpengary Pony Club One Day Event 2026</b>
Cross Country course is closed for riding for all riders from Sunday 17 <sup>th</sup> May 2026
Cross Country open for walking 2pm Saturday 30-5-26 & closes 8.00am Sunday 31-5-26
No motorised equipment on cross country unless authorised by TD or OC
Cross country briefings - Riders 7am Sunday 31-5-26 - Jump Judges 7.15am
Some classes may show jump before cross country, Draw will be emailed Updates will be on the BPC Event Facebook page. One Star and 95cm Saturday.
Riders may ride 2 competitive horses, but in different classes for scheduling reasons.
All riders must wear current level Body Protectors and Medical Armbands on cross country phase as per PCAQ Rules. Horse Health Declarations required on the day of the event.
All gear rules as per the PCA 2026 National Rule Book. Event run under PCAQ Rules.
Competitors must compete in full pony club uniform. Formal uniform to collect awards.
Any NON-current Hendra vaccinated horses staying overnight are recommended to stay in a stable or covered yard due to proximity of bat colony.
As a condition of entry, each club <b>MUST</b> provide a fence steward and dressage penciller for every three (3) entries or part thereof.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Organising committee reserves the right to: cancel any class or event: to combine or divide any class according to the numbers nominated and the rules governing splitting of groups: to alter advertised times, transfer competitors between sections of a class: to refuse any entry with or without stating a reason</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Disclaimer: Neither the organising committee of this event nor the PCAQ, accept any liability for the damage, accident, injury or illness to horses, riders, spectators or any other persons or property whatsoever. Competitors must be current financial members of PCAQ.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Stable or Yard Bond - This will be refunded via the entry process. You will only receive a refund if your stable has been cleaned of all manure, hay or any other material that is not sawdust. Please get stable manager or someone from the OC to inspect and lock when done.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Refunds – Before close of entries you can withdraw on nominate or edit your entry. There will be no refund of entry fees for withdrawals after close of entries unless a written request with Vet or Doctor certificate included within 7 days and a 10% administration fee will be deducted. In the Event an extreme weather event there will be a 20% administration fee held if the event is cancelled. The final responsibility for the suitability of the mount, saddlery and equipment rests with the Rider or their responsible adults. (see General Rules). In the event of a tie with the highest place QOTT, it then goes to lowest penalty dressage score.</li> </ul>	<p>Riders in classes 1 – 6 must produce performance cards to the office prior to 8.00am on day of competition unless other arrangements have been made with the organising committee. If rider does not have performance card on the day of competition, ribbons and trophies are withheld until it is produced. Nominations that do not have Horse Registration number and riders who do not have performance card on the day, will compete HC</p> <p>Seniors nominating in Preliminary or above, must be competing in this level at EA events. If horse/rider are riding up from Introductory for the first time, then copies of 3 MERs need to be supplied to the Club with the nomination.</p>	<p>SENIORS -Preferably, rider should complete the “Application for Horse Trials Upgrade” form and send this to PCAQ with copies of the relevant MERS. They will be issued with a card stating their grade. This is to be sighted by the club (there is no need for the club to record results at a competition If rider/horse has no previous eventing history, Senior is to compete in Pre-Introductory or Introductory only (preferably Pre-Intro). Seniors, to be eligible for overall award, must participate in Official classes 13-U26year Class 3-6. Seniors scored by Horse Trials Rule 13 p19 Horse Trials Rule Book. Seniors can compete and place in class 8.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Protests: Should be lodged within 30minutes of the results being posted, or the incident and should be accompanied by \$50 fee which is refundable only if the protest is upheld. In the case of objections to the qualifications of competitors, not later than half an hour before the start of the event or in the case of objections to the show jumping course, not later than 10 minutes after the walking of the course and before the start of the competition of in the case of objections to the cross country course not later than four hours before the advertised starting time of the cross country. See Rule 37 page 20 of Horse Trials Rule Book.</li> </ul>	<p>Riders must enter the correct class and must have MER’s to ride from Preliminary up as per Horse Trials rule book Rule 11 page 10. Riders cannot choose to upgrade on the day of the competition. This must be applied for and approved prior to the competition. Riders <b>MUST</b> compete in the class that is on their card. Those with an Introductory card, may also compete in pre-introductory. A horse is allowed to ride down one level from that stated on the performance card without penalty. If the horse competes at two or more levels down from what it has on its performance card, ten penalties will be added to its total.</p>	<p>OUR BIOSECURITY POLICY - All horse owners and competitors should be aware that you have a biosecurity obligation to take all reasonable steps to ensure your activities do not spread a pest, disease, or contaminant. Competitors to ensure good biosecurity practices at home and at the event and to follow the instructions of the organising committee and the Biosecurity Manager or risk expulsion from the event. OUR BIOSECURITY PLAN - Our event biosecurity plan is a set of preventative control measures and actions aimed at reducing the risk of infectious diseases and pests on and off the venue, and between horses at the venue.
