## **NOTE ON TEAMS CLASSES**

The team events will run in conjunction with the individual events. E.g. competitors complete the event and allocate 2 phases towards a team with another competitor.

Competitors must pre-nominate which phases they are doing.

Teams consist of up to 2 team members – they each do up to 2 phases to count towards their overall score

Competitors can be in multiple teams.

Competitors must compete in Classes 1-8 to be in a team event.

Parent/child/sibling team must be from the same family.

Select a cool name for your teams.

## **SCORING**

### **CHOOSE YOUR JUMPING HEIGHT:**

Max Points available 1400 .

Rider may select a lower jumping height. This will result in a lower maximum points available.

## SWIMMING

Optimum times earning 1100 points are:

9 years & Under	50m	All	22pts/m

17 – 25 years	200m	All	5.5pts/m

Competitors will be required to swim for a set distance.

A signal (horn, whistle or bell, etc.) will indicate the start of the swim.

Marshalls will record and ensure all swimmers complete the required distance for their class / age. There will be a Marshall at the each end of the pool with a Marshall ensuring the swimmer turns/touches the pool correctly and one Marshall timing the swim for each competitor.

## SHOOTING

9 years & Under will shoot at 5m - 1 or 2 hands

10-12 year olds will shoot at 7m - 1 or 2 hands

13 years to 51+ will shoot at 10m - 1 hand

# ADDITIONAL RULES:

1. Formal Club uniform to be worn for the riding phase and presentation.
2. Bibs provided lost bibs will be charged for.
3. The shooting phase is club formal uniform, club polo shirt or sport shirt for non PCQ members.
4. Footwear for shooting is to be sneakers that don't cover the ankle.
5. Swimsuits to be 1 piece – no bikinis.
6. Running preferably the club polo or a running shirt in your club colour but is not compulsory. No crop tops.
7. For specific phase requirement details see rules.
8. The riding phase will include a mixture of show jumps, XC Jumps, a gate, and a sliprail. Note some obstacles may be adapted for Unofficial mini riders.
9. As per the PCA (Pony Club Australia) National Tetrathlon rules with a few scoring modifications to create the unofficial classes. Please read the 2026 [2026-Tetrathlon-Rules-QLD-PCA-Combined-FINAL-CLEAN.pdf](#)
10. All riders are required to stay for the presentation, unmounted and in formal club uniform.
11. The final copy of the draw will be emailed out. Please listen for scratching/changes on the day.
12. 1 horse 1 rider – 1 rider 1 horse for Tetrathlon
13. Age is as at 1 Jan 2026 (to match PCA rules).
14. No rider is to have their phone whilst mounted, using phones whilst mounted will be eliminated for the day..
15. Horses cannot be left at floats without vehicles attached. Organise your own transport/car-pooling to the swimming pool prior to the event.
16. Yards are available for horses while at the pool.
17. Horse Health Declarations to be handed in prior to the start of the event.
18. **One event helper per family is mandatory.** By nominating you are also agreeing to help with an appropriate event role assigned by the committee, if helpers miss their allocated role and do not find a replacement the associated competitor will ride HC and not receive a qualifier.
19. No dogs allowed.
20. Whilst an official gear check will be carried out, the safety of rider's gear is ultimately the responsibility of the competitor and their parent / guardian.
21. Please ensure you do the necessary DPI travel requirements and checks prior if leaving a tick property.
22. Competitors will ride/compete in the order of the draw. A provisional draw will be emailed. Riders must be prepared to ride earlier if there are scratching's. Start times will be announced over the PA on the day of competition.
23. If there are less than 3 riders in any class, classes may be combined. If there are more than 3 boys AND 3 girls in a class then they may be split. Run under current (2025) Pony Club Australia & Pony Club Queensland rules – please familiarize yourself with these rules.
24. Judges' decision is final
25. ALL COMPETITORS MUST BE CURRENT 2026 RIDING MEMBERS OF PCA.
26. Protests must be in writing to the Club Secretary, accompanied by \$50, within 30 minutes of the results being posted, or the incident. \$50 is refundable only if the protest is upheld.
27. Bad language, excessive striking of the horse, abuse or disrespect to the judge or officials will result in disqualification.

## **PCAQ RULES APPLY TO THIS EVENT, INCLUDING ALL BY-LAWS, RULES AND POLICIES, AND INCLUDING THE FOLLOWING:**

28. Competitors must be current financial members of PCAQ
29. HELMET Equestrian helmet AS/NZS 3838, EN 1384 or ASTM F1163, with an effective chin strap.
30. Riders with unstamped helmets of the required specification will not be expected to replace them.

31. For competition – only black, brown, navy blue & white are allowed.
32. The Helmet must be worn whenever mounted under Pony Club supervision, including to & from the Pony Club - this includes seniors & instructors. Candidates at Instructor Schools must wear helmets.
33. Mounted Voluntary Helpers must wear the regulation headgear.
34. Riders must keep helmets on during Mounted Presentation of Awards & while saluting.
35. FACE GUARDS Allowed on ASA equestrian helmets.
36. HELMET COVER Detachable Helmet Covers are permitted in Mounted Games & Cross Country only in combination of shirt and tie colours of club/zone. Black, brown, navy blue and white can be worn in any competition.
37. SUNSHADE/SUN PROTECTOR Can be worn over or under helmet.
38. One senior official from each club to form a Dispute Committee, nominee to be lodged with entries. The committee's decision will be final.
39. All competitors to be in full uniform for presentations please.
40. Horse Health Declarations (HHD) required on the day of the event - NO HHD NO Ride

### **DISCLAIMER**

41. Neither the Organising Committee of this event to which these rules apply, nor PCQ accepts any liability for any accident, damage, injury, illness or harm to horses, owners, riders, spectators or any other persons or property whatsoever, howsoever caused.
42. The final responsibility for the suitability of the mount, saddlery and equipment rests with the Rider or their responsible adult. (see General Rules)

### **RESERVATION OF RIGHTS**

43. No refunds of entry fee, with the exception of scratching prior to the commencement of the event AND a written request for a refund of nomination, including a vet/medical certificate or Chief Instructor's report, to be received within 7 days after the event. A 10% administration fee may be retained. If the event is cancelled due to rain, nominate will withhold their fees
44. The organising committee reserves the right to; cancel any class or event, combine or divide classes according to the numbers nominated and the rules governing splitting of groups, alter advertised times, transfer competitors between sections of a class and to refuse any entry with or without stating a reason.
45. Protests: Should be lodged within 30 minutes of the results being posted, or the incident and should be accompanied by \$50 fee which is refundable only if the protest is upheld.

# BIOSECURITY FACT SHEET

We take biosecurity seriously and have measures in place to mitigate the risk of infection, diseases and pests.

## OUR BIOSECURITY POLICY:

All horse owners and competitors should be aware that you have a biosecurity obligation to take all reasonable steps to ensure your activities do not spread a pest, disease, or contaminant.

Competitors are asked to ensure good biosecurity practices at home and at the event and to follow the instructions of the organising committee and the Biosecurity Manager or risk expulsion from the event.

All horses entering grounds must be from a property actively practising good biosecurity principles within their management.

Horse Health Declarations (HHD) are mandatory requirement for all events. Please read the HHD form and ensure:

- Your horses are shampooed, rinsed and allowed to dry, and their hooves are picked clean of all solid material and washed with shampoo.
- Your vehicles and equipment accompanying the horses are cleaned to remove all solid material that could contain disease agents, and then disinfected.

Acceptance into the event will be refused if the required HHD is not presented at point of entry or designated registration point, as advised by the organising committee. The property identification code (PIC) of the horse's origin must be included on the HHD.

Other biosecurity and workplace health and safety measures that aim to provide the safest environment for horses, competitors, volunteers and visitors include:

- No horses or dogs with signs of illness are to be brought onto the grounds.
- No communal horse water troughs are available at this event.
- Do not share equipment, including food and water containers, between horses.
- Competitors are responsible for cleaning up manure from yards and placing it in designated areas. Please use your own rakes/shovels.
- Competitors are required to advise the event organisers immediately if a horse is sick. Stop all non-essential contact with the sick horse. Do not allow children to have close contact with the sick horses.
- Everyone handling horses should wash or sanitise hands between contacting different horses.

## OUR BIOSECURITY PLAN

Our event biosecurity plan is a set of preventative control measures and actions aimed to reducing the risk of infections diseases and pests on and off the venue, and between horses at the venue.

## WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE UNLIKELY EVENT OF A BIOSECURITY INCIDENT

In the unlikely event of a biosecurity incident, the Biosecurity Manager and the Organising Committee will implement our Event Biosecurity Plan. You will be notified about the incident and expected to follow the directions given by the organising committee. Everyone will be expected to remain at the venue until cleared to leave by the organising committee and Biosecurity Manager.

In the event if horse movement restrictions participants are responsible for the care, maintenance and cost of their horses and themselves, including feeding, bedding, vets and personal needs.

If a horse is confirmed to have an infectious disease/s the owner/lessee will be responsible for all vet cost and if venue is locked down and quarantined will be responsible for all costs associated with this.
