COMPETITORS MUST BE CURRENT MEMBERS OF PCQ OR PCA & HAND IN A HEALTH DEC FORM AND PREFILLED PERFORMANCE CARD (OFFICIAL CLASSES 1-9) ON ARRIVAL.

DRAW emailed to competitors via Nominate.

Rules:

Run under PCA National Gear Rules & 2026 PCQ Rules. A rider may ride two horses in the same or different class and be eligible for overall awards on both horses: one in official class and one in unofficial class; or 2 in the official classes; or two in the unofficial classes. The organizing committee reserves the right to combine or split classes according to the number of nominations, and alter or amend the program as necessary. The club reserves the right to refuse an entry with or without providing a reason.

RESERVATION OF RIGHTS The organising committee reserves the right to: cancel any class or event, combine classes if less than 3 competitors, or divide classes according to the numbers nominated and the rules governing splitting of groups, alter advertised times, transfer competitors between sections of a class, and to refuse any entry with or without stating a reason.

Late nominates if accepted will be \$45 per class

One helper/penciller will be required for every 3 nominations or part thereof per club. Rider's Club to ensure helping positions are filled. No helpers = No riders.

Horse Health declaration and Performance Cards:

Horse Health decs and Performance Cards must be handed in prior to collecting back numbers. If no performance card prizes may be withheld until card is produced.

Protests:

Judges decision is final and there will be no discussion taken with the judge, you must lodge a protest accompanied by \$50. Must be within 30 minutes of result posting, accompanied by \$50 fee.

Refunds:

Will be made providing the organizing body is advised of the scratching before the commencement of the event and a written request including a vet or doctor's certificate is sent to the organizing committee within a week of the event. A 10% administration fee may be retained.

Draw:

Draw will be available on our Facebook events page and riders will receive an email through nominate.

Canteen:

Full Canteen facilities will be available on the day.

Weather:

In case of inclement weather, we will post if cancelled on Nerang pony clubs face book page and email.

Disclaimer:

Neither the Organizing Committee nor the PCAQ accept any liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to horse, owner, rider or any other person or property.

Biosecurity Fact Sheet

We take biosecurity seriously and have measures in place to mitigate the risk of infections, diseases and pests.

OUR BIOSECURITY POLICY

All horse owner's and competitors should be aware that you have a biosecurity obligation to take all reasonable steps to ensure your activities do not spread a pest, disease, or contaminant.

Competitors are asked to ensure good biosecurity practices at home and at the event and to follow the instructions of the Organising Committee and the Biosecurity Manager or risk expulsion form the event.

All horses entering the grounds must be from a property actively practicing good biosecurity principles within their management.

Horse Health Declarations (HHD) are a mandatory requirement for all events. Please read HHD and ensure:

*Your horses are shampooed, rinsed and allowed to dry, and their hooves are picked clean of all solid material and washed with shampoo.

*Your vehicles and equipment accompanying the horses are cleaned to remove all solid materials that could contain disease agents, and then disinfected.

Acceptance into the event will be refused if the required HHD is not presented at point of entry or designated registration point, as advised by the Organising Committee.

The Property Identification Code (PIC) of the horse's origin must be included in the HHD.

Other Biosecurity and workplace health and safety measures that aim to provide the safest environment for horses, competitors, volunteers and visitors include:

*No horses with signs of illness are to be brought on to the grounds.

*No communal water troughs are available at this event.

*Do not feed horses on the ground.

*Do not share equipment, including food and water containers, between horses.

*Competitors are responsible for cleaning up manure from yards and placing it in designated areas / or spreading it on the grass. Please use your own rakes and shovels.

*Competitors are required to advise the event organisers immediately if a horse is sick. Stop all non-essential contact with a sick horse. Do not allow children to have close contact with a sick horse.

*Everyone handling horses should wash or sanitise hands between contacting different horses.

Our BIOSECURITY PLAN is a set of preventative control measures and actions aimed at reducing the risk of infectious diseases and pests on and off the venue, and between horses at the venue.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE UNLIKELY EVENT OF A BIOSECURITY INCIDENT:

In the unlikely event of a biosecurity incident, the Biosecurity Manager and the Organising Committee will implement our Event Biosecurity Plan.

You will be notified about the incident and expected to follow the directions given by the Organising Committee.

Everyone will be expected to remain at the venue until cleared by the Organising Committee and Biosecurity Manager.

In the event of horse movement restrictions, participants are responsible for the care, maintenance and cost of the horse and themselves, including feeding, bedding, vets and personal needs.

If a horse is confirmed to have an infectious disease, the owner / lessee will be responsible for all vet costs, and if the venue is locked down and quarantined, will be responsible
