**** Please note this is a tag-along with Toowoomba Jump Club. Riders/Horses can only nominate in ONE program (EA OR PC). There will be a cap of 80 PCQ riders at this event. ****

- All entries must include the name of a helper (jobs to be allocated by organisers).
- No transferring of classes after entries close, unless horse has been upgraded, otherwise rider will compete HC in new class.
- All dressage tests from Eventing Australia website
- Cross country maps will be available via Cross Country app
- Please note that electronic scooters are banned by the RASQ; cross country must be walked on foot

Seniors: to be eligible for overall awards, must compete in 13 & u26yrs classes

Performance cards and Horse Health Declarations to be handed to Office prior to start.

- Timetable:** Rider Briefing – Saturday from 5pm
Dressage – Saturday from 8am
Showjumping – Saturday from 11am
Cross Country – Sunday from 8am (available to walk from Sat 12pm)
Cross Country stewards briefing – 7am, Sunday
- Awards:** Ribbons to 5th place in each class.
Prizes being sourced for each class.
- The draw will be emailed to competitors, posted on Nominate and on Zone Facebook page*

NB: Competitors must provide their own number for all phases – bridle or saddle cloth number are acceptable for dressage and showjumping only. Paper copies for number holders will be provided on request at office.

- Refunds:** Refunds provided before close of entries. After close of entries, only with vet or medical certificate, less 10% admin fee. No stable refunds after close of entry.
- Disputes:** Complaints to be lodged with Organising Secretary, in writing, accompanied by \$50, within 30 minutes of results being posted.
- Disclaimer:** Neither the organising committee of this event nor the PCAQ, accept any liability for the damage, accident, injury or illness to horses, riders, spectators or any other persons or property whatsoever. Competitors must be current financial members of PCAQ.
- Reservation of Rights:** The Organising committee reserves the right to: cancel any class or event: to combine or divide any class according to the numbers nominated and the rules governing splitting of groups: to alter advertised times, transfer competitors between sections of a class: to refuse any entry with or without stating a reason

Catering: Canteen operating both days.

Camping & Stabling: Available for the weekend – pay on Nominate with entry. All stables will be allocated (plan available upon release of draw). All campsites will be monitored. Anyone found camping/stabling without permission will be fined.

All riders: All manure to be cleaned from stable AND around horse float areas and placed in the pile/s designated. Parking areas will be monitored.

Rules & Conditions

Riders and parents must ensure that these are observed as they will be enforced.

- All events will be run under the 2026 PCQ Rules for Horse Trials. This includes body protectors and medical arm band required for cross country phase
- Horses must not be under 4 years of age.
- All horses must be graded under PCQ rules – check 2026 Horse Trials rule book for clarification.
- Two Horse Rule applies – must be in different classes for scheduling reasons.
- All riders must wear body protectors: BETA:2018 – Level 3 or EN13158:2018 – Level 3, and medical armbands on cross country phase. Air vests are not to be used without a body protector underneath unless they are hybrid.
- Performance cards are required for Classes 1-6. If rider does not have performance card on the day of competition, ribbons and trophies are withheld until it is produced. Nominations that do not have Horse Registration Number AND riders do not have performance card on the day, riders will compete HC.
- Riders cannot choose to upgrade on the day of the competition. This must be applied for and approved prior to the competition. Riders MUST compete in the class that is on their card. A horse is allowed to ride down one level from that stated on the performance card without penalty. If the horse competes at two or more levels down from what it has on its performance card, ten penalties will be added to its total.
- **Seniors:** nominating in Preliminary or above, must be competing in this level at EA events. If horse/rider are riding up from Introductory for the first time, then copies of 3 MERs need to be supplied to the Club with the nomination. Preferably, rider should complete the “Application for Horse Trials Upgrade” form and send this to PCQ with copies of the relevant MERS. They will be issued with a card stating their grade. This is to be sighted by the Club (there is no need for the Club to record results at a competition). If rider/horse has no previous eventing history, Senior is to compete in Pre-Introductory or Introductory only (preferably Pre-Intro).
- **Competitors must be in full uniform to collect ribbons and prizes.**
