Showjumping will be run throughout the day so riders may SJ before their XC

Nominations: All nominations are to be lodged online via www.nominate.com.au

Only one horse per rider due to number restrictions

One helper will be required for every three riders (or part thereof) nominated. Helper details are to be recorded at time of nomination. Rider's Club responsibility to ensure helping positions are filled.

Entries will be capped at 75 riders. No transferring of classes after entries close, unless horse has upgraded. If rider transfers class after walking XC course, rider will ride HC in new class.

Riders cannot choose to upgrade on the day of the competition. This must be applied for and approved prior to the competition. Riders MUST compete in the class that is on their card. Those with an Introductory card, may also compete in Pre-Introductory (Sect 8c). A horse is allowed to ride down one level from that stated on the performance card without penalty. If the horse competes at two or more levels down from what it has on its performance card, ten penalties will be added to its total. **Seniors nominating in Preliminary or above**, must be competing in this level at EA events. If horse/rider are riding up from Introductory for the first time, then copies of 3 MERs need to be supplied to the Club with the nomination or show the Club their card stating their grade. If rider/horse has no previous eventing history, Senior is to compete in Pre-Introductory or Introductory only (preferably Pre-Intro). **Entries Close: Saturday 15th of August 2026 or once cap is reached.**

Overnight: Unpowered Campsite \$15 per night, Powered Campsite \$25 per night, Yards \$15 per day/night

Rules: Run under PCQ rules. <https://www.equestrian.org.au/Eventing-Dressage-tests>

Medical armbands & body protectors must be worn in x country phase

Judges' decision is final and there will be no discussion taken with the judge, you must lodge a protest accompanied by \$50.

The club reserves the right to refuse an entry with or without providing a reason.

Protests: Must be within 30 minutes of result posting, accompanied by \$50 fee.

Refunds: Will be made providing the organising body is advised of the scratching before the start of the event and a written request including a vet or doctor's certificate is sent to the organizing committee within a week of the event. A 10% administration fee may be retained.

Draw: Draw will be available on our Facebook page by 10pm, Friday 21st August 2026.

Back Numbers: Riders need to collect paper numbers at checkin. Please bring your own back number holder.

Performance Cards: Completed Performance cards are required for classes 1 – 6, must be handed to in prior to the commencement of event. Rider cannot compete above the grade stated on the card. Performance card number must be on the nomination. If rider does not have card on the day of competition, awards will be withheld until it is produced. Noms with no performance card number and rider does not have card on the day, rider will compete HC.

HPHD: Horse and Participant Health Declarations to be handed in prior to the start of the event.

BIOSECURITY FACT SHEET

We take biosecurity seriously and have measures in place to mitigate the risk of infections, diseases and pests.



COVID:

Please remember:

- Social Distancing – stay 1.5m apart from people you don't live with;
- Wash your hands regularly with soap and water and use alcohol-based sanitiser;
- Practice respiratory etiquette;
- Stay at home if you are sick or have been to a hotspot in the past 14 days.

OUR BIOSECURITY POLICY

All horse owners and competitors should be aware that you have a biosecurity obligation to take all reasonable steps to ensure your activities do not spread a pest, disease or contaminant.

Competitors are asked to ensure good biosecurity practices at home and at the event and to follow the instructions of the organising committee and the Biosecurity Manager or risk expulsion from the event.

All horses entering grounds must be from a property actively practising good biosecurity principles within their management:

Horse Health and Participant Declarations (HHD) are a mandatory requirement for all events: Please read the HHD form and ensure:

Your horses are shampooed, rinsed and allowed to dry, and their hooves are picked clean of all solid material and washed with shampoo

Your vehicles and equipment accompanying the horses are cleaned to remove all solid material that could contain disease agents, and then disinfected:

Acceptance into the event will be refused if the required HHD is not presented at point of entry or designated registration point, as advised by the organising committee:

The property identification code (PIC) of the horse's origin must be included on the HHD:

Other biosecurity and workplace health and safety measures that aim to provide the safest environment for horses, competitors, volunteers and visitors include:

- No horses or dogs with signs of illness are to be brought onto the grounds.
- No communal horse water troughs are available at this event.
- Do not share equipment, including food and water containers, between horses.
- Competitors are responsible for cleaning up manure from yards and placing it in designated areas. Please use your own rake/shovels.
- Competitors are required to advise the event organisers immediately if a horse is sick. Stop all non-essential contact with the sick horse. Do not allow children to have close contact with the sick horse.
- Everyone handling horses should wash or sanitise hands between contacting different horses.

OUR BIOSECURITY PLAN

Our event biosecurity plan is a set of preventative control measures and actions aimed at reducing the risk of infectious diseases and pests on and off the venue, and between horses at the venue.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE UNLIKELY EVENT OF A BIOSECURITY INCIDENT

In the unlikely event of a biosecurity incident, the Biosecurity Manager and the organizing committee will implement our event biosecurity plan.

You will be notified about the incident and expected to follow the directions given by the organising committee.

Everyone will be expected to remain at the venue until cleared to leave by the organising committee and Biosecurity Manager.

In the event of horse movement restrictions participants are responsible for the care, maintenance and cost of their horses and themselves, including feeding, bedding, vets and personal needs.

If a horse is confirmed to have an infectious diseases the owner/ lessee will be responsible for all vet cost and if venue is locked down and quarantined will be responsible for all cost associated with this.
