CROSS COUNTRY COURSE WALK: 3pm 5th September

CROSS COUNTRY JUDGES BRIEFING: 730 am 6th September

CROSS COUNTRY START TIME: 830am 6th September

MOTHER GOOSE GROUP: All 3 phases to be run Saturday 5th September. Cross country to go out after completion of showjumping phase

Depending on nominations showjumping for all classes to be conducted Saturday afternoon at the conclusion of the dressage.

Competitors must be current financial members of PCAQ

HELMET Equestrian helmet AS/NZS 3838, EN 1384 or ASTM F1163, with an effective chin strap. Riders with unstamped helmets of the required specification will not be expected to replace them. For competition – only black, brown, navy blue & white are allowed.

All riders **MUST** wear body protector: BETA 2018 Level 3, BETA 2009 Level , EN13158: 2009 Level , EN 13158 20018 Level 3 and medical armbands on cross country phase **Air vests are not to be used without a body protector underneath unless they are hybrid.**

Mounted Voluntary Helpers must wear the regulation headgear.

Riders must keep helmets on during Mounted Presentation of Awards & while saluting.

Riders may enter 2 horses in the same or different classes.

Bad language and excessive striking of horse, abuse or disrespect to the judge or officials will result in disqualification

HELMET COVER Detachable Helmet Covers are permitted in Mounted Games & Cross Country only in combination of shirt and tie colours of club/zone. Black, brown, navy blue and white can be worn in any competition.

SUNSHADE/SUN PROTECTOR Can be worn over or under helmet.

One senior official from each club to form a Dispute Committee, nominee to be lodged with entries. The committee's decision will be final.

All competitors to be in full uniform for presentations please.

Horse Health Declarations (HHD) required on the day of the event - NO HHD NO Ride

RIDERS CANNOT CHOOSE TO UPGRADE ON THE DAY OF COMPETITION: This must be applied for and approved prior to the competition. Riders MUST compete in the class that is on their card. Those with an Introductory card, may also compete in Pre- Introductory (sect8c). a horse is allowed to ride down one level from that stated on the performance card without penalty. If the horse competes at two or more levels down from what it has on its performance card, ten penalties will be added to its total.

Seniors nominating in preliminary or above, must be competing in this level at EA events. If horse/rider are riding up from introductory for the first time, then copies of 3 MERs need to be supplied to the club with the nomination preferably, rider should complete the” application for horse trials upgrade” form and send this to PCQ with copies of relevant MERs. They will be issued with a card stating their grade. This is to be sighted by the cluv (there is no need for the club to record results at a competition) if rider/horse has no previous eventing history senior is to compete in the Pre-Introductory only (preferably Pre-Intro).
