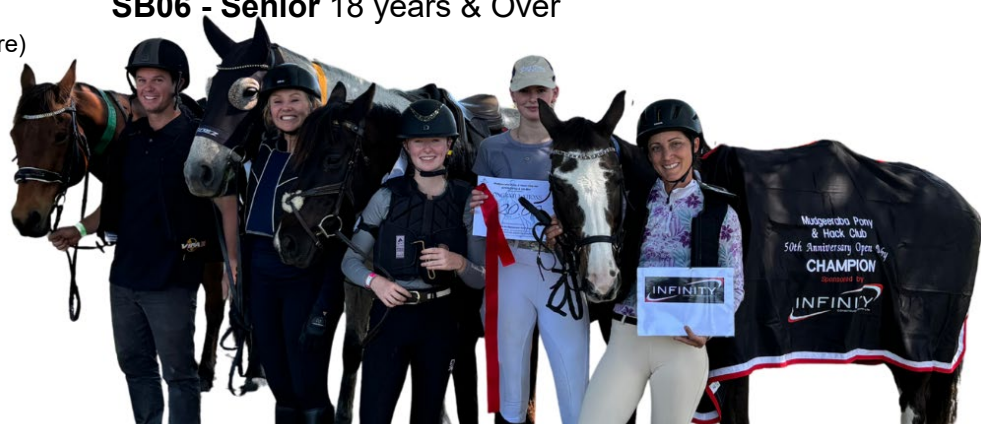

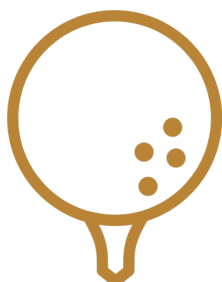

RULES

By entering and attending this event, riders and attendees agree to be bound by the following terms:

1. Membership & policies

- 1.1. **All competitors welcome.** However, if you are not a current riding Pony Club Australia member you acknowledge that you ride wholly at your own risk, a waiver must be signed, and an additional \$20 fee to be paid.
- 1.2. All Pony Club Australia rules, requirements, by-laws, policies and procedures, including but not limited to the:
 - Pony Club Australia National Gear Rules
 - Pony Club Australia Horse Welfare Policy
(copies of the above are available at <https://ponyclubaustralia.com.au>)
- 1.3. All Queensland and national biosecurity rules and requirements.
- 1.4. All Pony Club Queensland rules, requirements, by-laws, policies and procedures, including but not limited to:
 - Pony Club Queensland General Rules
 - Pony Club Queensland Showjumping Rules
(copies of the above are available on the PCQ website <https://ponyclubqld.com.au/>)
- 1.5. All Mudgeeraba Pony & Hack Club Incorporated rules and policies, including taking reasonable direction from the committee and other officials.
- 1.6. Mudgeeraba Pony & Hack Club Incorporated reserves the right to alter the program & terms of competition without prior notice
- 1.7. You acknowledge that Mudgeeraba Pony & Hack Club Incorporated have a zero-tolerance policy towards:
 - excessive use of the whip or unreasonable use of force against an animal,
 - foul, threatening, or defamatory language or behaviour towards judges, officials, volunteers or any event attendee,

and any offence to the above may result in elimination, disqualification or exclusion from the event venue.

2. Mount

- 2.1. A horse may only be ridden by one competitor on the day, unless the second rider has been approved by the TD taking into consideration welfare of the horse. The second rider must ride HC and is ineligible to place.
- 2.2. A horse may do no more than one 6 bar class, and no more than two derby rounds.
- 2.3. Pursuant to PCQ SJ rules, a rider may only compete on 2 horses on the day.

3. Body protectors

- 3.1. All riders must wear body protectors (BETA 2018 Level 3, BETA 2009 Level 3, EN13158:2009 Level 3, EN13158: 2018 Level 3) and medical armbands on course

4. We help, we ride

- 4.1. **Each competitor must provide a volunteer** (which may be themselves) to help with a task on the event day. Failure to do so may result in the rider being disqualified or riding HC.

5. Protest

- 5.1. Any protests must be accompanied by a fee of \$50 cash and lodged within 15 minutes of the completion of the disputed event. Should the protest be dismissed the fee will not be refunded. Otherwise, any decision of a judge is final.

6. Disclaimer

- 6.1. Riders and event attendees acknowledge and accept that equestrian sports are inherently dangerous. Neither the Mudgeeraba Pony and Hack Club Inc, including event organisers and volunteers, nor the PCQ accept any liability for the damage, accident, injury or illness to riders, horses, spectators or any other person or property, howsoever caused, including in negligence.
- 6.2. By nominating or attending this event you acknowledge that you ride at your own risk and that you have read and accepted these conditions.

NO DOGS OR ALCOHOL ALLOWED, FIRST AID OFFICER IN ATTENDANCE

BIOSECURITY FACT SHEET

We take biosecurity seriously and have measures in place to mitigate the risk of infection, diseases and pests.

OUR BIOSECURITY POLICY

All horse owners and competitors should be aware that you have a biosecurity obligation to take all reasonable steps to ensure your activities do not spread a pest, disease, or contaminant.

Competitors are asked to ensure good biosecurity practices at home and at the event and to follow the instructions of the organising committee and the Biosecurity Manager or risk expulsion from the event.

All horses entering grounds must be from a property actively practising good biosecurity principles within their management.

Horse Health Declarations (HHD) are mandatory requirement for all events. Please read the HHD form and ensure:

- Your horses are shampooed, rinsed and allowed to dry. Hooves are picked clean of all solid material and washed with shampoo.
- Your vehicles and equipment accompanying the horses are cleaned to remove all solid material that could contain disease agents and to be then disinfected.

Acceptance into the event will be refused if the required HHD is not presented at point of entry or designated registration point, as advised by the organising committee. The property identification code (PIC) of the horse's origin must be included on the HHD.

Other biosecurity and workplace health and safety measures that aim to provide the safest environment for horses, competitors, volunteers and visitors include:

- No horses with signs of illness are to be brought onto the grounds.
- No communal horse water troughs are available at this event.
- Do not share equipment, including food and water containers, between horses.
- Competitors are responsible for cleaning up manure from yards and placing it in designated areas. Please use your own rakes/shovels.
- Competitors are required to advise the event organisers immediately if a horse is sick. All non-essential contact with a sick horse is to be ceased. Do not allow children to have close contact with sick horses.
- Everyone handling horses should sanitise hands between contacting different horses.

OUR BIOSECURITY PLAN

Our event biosecurity plan is a set of preventative control measures and actions aimed to reducing the risk of infectious diseases and pests on and off the venue, and between horses at the venue.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE UNLIKELY EVENT OF A BIOSECURITY INCIDENT

In the unlikely event of a biosecurity incident, the Biosecurity Manager and the Organising Committee will implement our Event Biosecurity Plan. You will be notified about the incident and expected to follow the directions given by the organising committee. Everyone will be expected to remain at the venue until cleared to leave by the organising committee and Biosecurity Manager.

In the event of horse movement restrictions, participants are responsible for the care, maintenance and cost of their horses and themselves, including feeding, bedding, vets and personal needs.

If a horse is confirmed to have an infectious disease/s the owner/lessee will be responsible for all vet cost and if venue is locked down and quarantined will be responsible for all costs associated with this.
